

















#### Student Spotlight — Chase Mitchell

The children in Room 25 have been learning about winter weather. The students and Teacher Denise McGowan, made snow in their classroom! They had a great time while learning.















#### ...While Room 21 is Ready For Spring!

The seminar begins at 7:00 p.m. and will run approximately 1 1/2 hours.




