We conducted 52 forensic interviews in Quarter 3 (July-September) and served 10 different counties!!



What is a forensic interview?

A forensic interview is a neutral, fact-finding interaction conducted by a specially trained interviewer using a multi-disciplinary approach in response to allegations of alleged abuse and/or maltreatment. Children ages 3-17 come to JACY House when there has been a report that the child may have experienced some form of abuse or may have witnessed violence. The forensic interviewer allows the child to talk about the events in a one-on-one discussion with the multi-disciplinary team observing from an adjacent room. A forensic interview is not an interrogation, but a nonthreatening and non-leading interview.

Upcoming Community Opportunities

JACY House is now offering the Darkness to Light Stewards of Children training to adults in the community. This 2.5 hour training is great for any organization or person that wants more information on how to prevent and respond to child abuse.
