

Itching to take it out, he and Theresa cruised to Branch Brook Park to view the cherry blossoms and sent these pictures





CONVERTIBLES HAVE A funny way of romanticizing wind-blown hair and sunburned cheeks. There's something about open-air driving that seems so carefree and exhilarating.

In the early years of automobiles, roofless was the only way to roll, with motorists exposed to the elements. In 1910, Cadillac set the standard for a fully enclosed model, made more affordable through mass production in the 1920s.

Over the years, celebrities have popularized convertibles (in our imaginations if not in our driveways). Actors Errol Flynn and Clark Gable famously drove their

Howard Darrin-designed Packards with the tops down in the 1930s. Flynn's custom-made 1941 Peach Packard was legendary for its time.





1955-1956 THUNDERBIRD SIMULATED WIRE WHEEL COVER


INNER CAP IS RED CENTER FOR 1955 MODEL OR WHITE CENTER FOR 1956 MODEL



1
Clips should be evenly spaced with the valve positioned between two clips. If balance weights interfere, rearrange spacing positions by placing clips not less than one-half inch from balance weights. (Note: Do not place clip over valve stem.)



2
To fasten clips, press each clip firmly against lip of rim as shown and hit extreme top of clip with hammer until clip snaps securely over lip of rim.



3
Install rubber bumpers on clips as positioned above—pushing rubber bumper beyond locking dimples to secure it in position. See inset illustration.




4
To attach clips to Wire Wheel, pull free end of clip back away from wheel and hook to inner flange of Wire Wheel as shown above. (Note: Start operation from top of wheel.) Attach remaining five clips to Wire Wheel in same manner.



5
Make certain all clips are locked to inner flange of Wire Wheel and then, using both hands, push Wire Wheel onto wheel until it snaps into position.



6
When Wire Wheel is to be removed or pulled away from rim, place hands on collar and spokes and pull out.

With Wire Wheel pulled away from rim, checking air pressure or cleaning hub cap is an easy job. A clean hub cap will insure maximum reflection of the wire spokes.
