





'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'



TIME FOR PRAYERS AND CONFESSION: This year for the Season of Advent we are adding to worship an experiential rite. Instead of reciting words of prayer and confession we are asking worshippers to move about the sanctuary to three stations in any order.

One station will be a place to offer prayers for the world, our community or ourselves by writing the prayer on a slip of paper and rolling it up and placing it in the net.

Another station will have candles you are asked to light after giving confession, either by reading the confession at the station or offering our own silent confession.

The last station is at the baptismal font where you are asked to make a statement of faith then placing a stone in the water.

While we move about the sanctuary there will be special music playing. Please feel free to participate as you wish. Some may desire to remain seated and offer their own silent words.





DIRECTIONS FOR COMMUNION: Please come forward by the center aisle at the direction of the ushers to receive the sacrament and return to your seat down




