A Note from Pastor Toni

YUMC, we are moving toward the most significant Sunday of the entire year. For followers of Jesus it is the most important celebration we share.

EASTER—the Resurrection—

New Life—New Hope—New Possibilities—New beginnings.

There is not one person in our city and county who doesn't need Jesus in their life. Not one!! I am reminded of the story in the Gospel of John about Philip and Nathanael. After Jesus called Philip, Peter and Andrew to leave their boats and follow Him, Philip was *so excited* that he ran to find his friend, Nathanael, and tell him that they had found the Messiah!

Who have you run to lately and told that you have found the Messiah; that your life is different and richer and more fulfilled because you have found Jesus? What are you doing to deepen your relationship with the One who loves you most and loves you best; the One who laid down his life for you, only to take it up again and empower you with the same

Spirit that empowered Him to raise from death?

Church, please stop underestimating who you are and what you have been called to do. You are the presence of Jesus in Yreka! None of us is perfect, for sure, but we are all God has to do the work to which we have been called in the place where we have been planted! And we can do so much when we acknowledge what we have been given to give away! We have been given EASTER—the Resurrection—New Life—New Hope—New Possibilities—New Beginnings! We are His Easter people called to

step into a broken, messy world and bring hope. Why would we hesitate to give that away? I encourage and challenge you all to begin praying about whom God would have you invite to our Holy Week services—

Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday!

Let me remind you that it is not a church to which they are being invited. Instead think of it as an invitation to a party; a celebration, a great opportunity; an opportunity to experience the Resurrection side of the cross—to live a life of joy not just happiness, fulfillment not just momentary satisfaction, community, not just casual relationship, and above all, the love of God who depends on you to initiate invitation to new life in Jesus Christ!

EASTER—the Resurrection—New Life—New Hope—New Possibilities—New beginnings!!

Who wouldn't want to share that with someone? Listen, if Jesus as changed your life, and I certainly hope and pray that He has, then you have only one choice: to offer that same

life-changing experience to someone you know who doesn't yet know Him. Maybe there is someone in your circle of friends who has had a negative experience with church. Tell them about YUMC. Tell them how the Holy Spirit shows up in worship and lives are changed. Tell them that we are a diverse group of people who genuinely care about one another. Tell them that they too will feel welcomed

and that there is a place for everyone. *Tell them COG-POW'S!* AND...*BRING THEM*! Offer to pick them up on Easter Sunday. If they come on their own, meet them in the parking lot, introduce them to the folks in your church family. Take them to breakfast after church and ask them how they liked the experience. Invite them back the Sunday after Easter!!

FYI...the pastor doesn't grow the church, Church. <u>YOU DO!!!</u> Pray! Ask the Lord who to invite. Pray again. Begin telling them about your church. Pray again. Invite them to Maundy Thursday dinner and service, Good Friday and of course, Easter Sunday. The future of YUMC is in your hands. Take someone else by the hand and invite them into that future!

Happy April Church Family,





PS...If you happen to want to throw an extra loaf of bread or package of ham or box of chips in your shopping cart periodically the Tailgater's will make good use of them!



Cristina Alger's "The Bankers Wife" features three very strong female characters that make the novel work. And it is these three women who uncover a vast money laundering scheme created by the Swiss United bank to hide the cash behind mobsters, fraudsters, terrorists and the Bashir Assad family of Syria.

The women are Annabel, the wife of Matthew a Swiss United banker who dies mysteriously in a plane crash; Marina, the fiancé of Grant the son of a New York real estate developer who is running for president and Zoe, Matthew's assistant who collects documents outlining Swiss United's scheme. Marina worked previously as an investigative reporter whose boss dies in a presumed robbery gone bad in Connecticut.

Alger interlaces her plot by going back and forth between the three women who are all working independently to find out the extent of Swiss United's nefarious deeds. Of course, Annabel is highly interested in how and why her husband died and she puts to good use her art curator skills in examining evidence.

There is a fast-paced conclusion, with a few people dying along the way, as the truth is ultimately revealed!


