Join with us as we celebrate this year's scholarship recipients. These scholarships are a symbol of RC 7's commitment to empowering the next generation of leaders and innovators.



# From the President's Desk...

## **AFT Convention Highlights**

Today's column is the report of the AFT Convention. Margo Buckingham represented RC 7 at this event held in Houston, Texas. (See photos on page 4.)

**AFT endorses Kamala Harris for President!** That, along with VP Harris in person speaking to the over 2000 delegates, was the highlight of the American Federation of Teachers Convention held in steamy Houston in July. The regular business on the agenda was the election of officers (we re-elected Randi Weingarten as President, Fedrick Ingram as Secretary Treasurer, Evelyn DeJesus as Executive VP) and the passing of resolutions which govern AFT's work for the next two years.

Resolutions of particular interest to retirees dealt with AFT's commitment to seniors, including the need to require screening for elder abuse at Medicare Wellness visits and by organizing elder care workers in all settings. There was also a special order of business which called for preserving and improving the U.S. health care safety net by strengthening both Medicare and Social Security as well as fighting the corporatization of health care.

Other resolutions sought to: limit the power of and damage done by private equity firms; support women's health care and reproductive rights; save SUNY Downstate; address issues around AI and social media; adapt school HVAC systems to deal with increased high temperatures; ensure safer and healthier workplaces for all; support public school librarians in the face of book-banning zealots; and oppose the "over-reach" of the Supreme Court. Another special order of business urged opposition to the aims outlined in Project 2025 and any candidate who supports it.

Delegates were also treated to the ideas of many excellent speakers. Delegates from the entire country got to hear our own John Mannion who is running for Congress. Shawn Fain, President of the UAW, wants union leaders to set all contracts to expire on the same day, May 1. Linda Kahn, Chair of the Federal Trade Commission spoke about the reduced quality of care that results when private equity firms buy up hospitals and medical practices. Rohit Chopra, Director of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, offered this: if you have credit card debt problems, CFPB can help. Start a case file with them at

### Participation fees for 2024 - 2025

**Active membership** in Retiree Council 7 is open to every NYSUT retiree of any NYSUT represented group in Election District 7. ED 7 is comprised of all units in Cayuga and Onondaga counties. Active members are those who have paid RC 7's participation fee of \$10 per year and, if required by the local, payment of local retiree fees.

**Please note**: If you retired from **Jordan-Elbridge**, **Liverpool**, **North Syracuse**, **Port Byron**, or **Syracuse City**, your fees are collected by your local (or chapter) and includes the voluntary RC 7 participation fee that is then sent to RC 7. The fees collected in these cases are determined by the local. You should use the local's address when sending in your check.

If you retired from Auburn, Cato-Meridian, Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES, Moravia, Skaneateles, Southern Cayuga, Union Springs, or Weedsport, your fees are collected by CORN (Cayuga-Onondaga Retirees of NYSUT) and forwarded to RC 7. Send your check to CORN @Auburn Teachers Association.
