
For all of us who attended Harold's Deli, it was great as usual. Sooo much food and big desserts. Thank you Toni Sabino for chairing this trip, job well done.



On 4/6/34, Ford announced that white wall tires would be an option











Ringwood Manor is a National Historic Landmark District, having historical importance spanning from Native American occupation through the early 20th century. The surrounding Ramapo Mountains' rich magnetite iron deposits made the area a major iron supplier and became the home to a succession of ironmasters for over two hundred years. During the Gilded Age, Ringwood Manor became a large summer estate for partners Peter Cooper and Abram S. Hewitt and their families. In 1938, the house, its contents, and the surrounding property were donated by the family to the State of New Jersey as a museum and a state park. With original historical structures, gardens, and landscapes on 582 acres and extensive historical collections illustrative of family life, community, industry and culture, Ringwood Manor is a unique repository of American history.

CRUISE TO BERTA'S CHATEAU (WANAQUE)

Berta's, located in a beautiful historic home, celebrated its 90 year anniversary in 2017! Come enjoy a delicious buffet starting with crudités, melon, baked stuffed clams, fresh ricotta with truffle honey, sea salt & black pepper, house marinated vegetables, tuna in olive oil, Tuscan beans & ceci, fresh mozzarella & ripe tomatoes in basil oil, roasted peppers, prosciutto di parma & Artisan salumi (coppa and salami). And after all of that...it's time for the main course, which includes Rotolo ("jelly-roll" of fresh pasta with spinach, ricotta and crescenza cheese), eggplant parmigiana, chicken breast in champagne sauce (light cream sauce) with mushrooms, slow-cooked free-range veal & peppers, green vegetable of the day and their house specialty farina dolce (a type of fried polenta with lemon & orange peel), rice pilaf, and penne. Don't forget to save room for the fresh seasonal berries and biscotti. Coffee and tea are included. Cash bar is available.
