Twenty-second Annual George N. Tuerck Competition Rules

Eligibility

- The competition is open to student musicians, eleventh grade or younger, who play orchestral instruments, including piano and harp.
- Winners who receive 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in the 2019 competition are not eligible to compete unless it is on a different instrument.
- Youth contestants do not need to be Youth Orchestra members to participate. However, youth who
 audition must be one of the following:
 - a. An Illinois resident of the counties surrounding Belleville or
 - b. A student of an Illinois music teacher or
 - c. A former or current member of the Belleville Philharmonic Youth Orchestra.
- Musicians who are not eligible for this competition are encouraged to participate in the Belleville Philharmonic's Stars of Tomorrow Competition held on March 21, 2020.

Repertoire and Competition

- Musicians should prepare at least one complete movement of a standard concerto or a composition
 for solo instrument and orchestra. The Tuerck committee may consider other selections with prior
 approval from the Youth Orchestra Director, Dr. Leon Burke. If you have any questions or want prior
 consent for a song, please email byo@bellevillephilharmonic.org.
- Competitors arrange for piano accompanists for the audition and provide music for their chosen piano accompanist. If you need an accompanist, please email byo@bellevillephilharmonic.org for a list.
- Students need to bring **three** copies of their selections for the judges.
- Memorization of the musical selection for the competition is **preferred**, **but not required**. Winners must play the same solo at the concert as they played at the audition.
- The Tuerck committee will schedule competition times and warmups for the 2020 contest at either the Belleville Philharmonic Hall or St. George Church. Committee members will inform contestants on their competition time and place. Organizers will make every effort to accommodate the preferred schedule.

Competition Winners

- The number of recipients chosen is up to the quality and quantity of the competitors, the award funds available that year from the Tuerck Scholarship Foundation, and the judges' discretion.
- The winner must be available to rehearse with the youth orchestra and perform at the **Tuerck Memorial Concert, typically held the first Saturday in December**. If orchestral accompaniment is not available, or the difficulty of the piece does not allow it, a winning contestant will perform at the Tuerck Memorial Concert with piano accompaniment. BPS will present winners with their certificates and monetary scholarship awards at the Tuerck Memorial Concert after their performance. Judges' decisions are final. Winners will be notified by mail within two weeks after the competition.
