






REMEMBER OUR VETERANS

American Legion Riders

With good weather the last few months, the Riders continued those activities that we could, given the Covid-19 restrictions. On October 17th the Riders did the last scheduled ride for 2020. We were joined by riders from other posts for the fall colors ride along the backroads to Atchison with lunch at Mueller's Locker Room and return through Weston. We are hopeful that the weather will permit some "special event" rides before we resume our regular scheduled rides in the spring.

The monthly dine out for September was held at Maggiano's Little Italy and in October it was at Stroud's in Overland Park. No dine outs will be held in November or December. COVID-19 restrictions permitting, the dine outs will resume on January 26th.

On November 8th eight riders enjoyed a Veterans Day Dinner at McCormick & Schmick's.

In September over 30 backpacks were donated and delivered to the Veterans Community Project. This was a request we received from VCP and our members graciously answered the call.

On November 18th five riders attended a well presented and truly relevant Accident Scene Management Course held at Post 370 in Overland Park. This course is offered by Road Guardians and tells us what to do until EMS arrives.

Our annual Christmas dinner is scheduled for December 10th following our short regular monthly meeting. Meat will be catered, and pot luck dishes will be offered by our members. Several members will do the serving.

Our monthly reoccurring activity schedule are: the 2nd Thursday is our meeting night at 7pm; the 4th Tuesday of each month is usually our Dine Out, 6p – 8p at selected restaurants; and members of the group continued to enjoy breakfasts together each Wednesday (BBBG) at various locations. Because of the increase in COVID-19 cases, our breakfasts are suspended until further notice.

The 2nd Sunday is normally our ALR Breakfast, however, buffet breakfasts are not permitted in the current environment. We have <u>cancelled plans for breakfasts for the remainder of the year</u> and will review the situation in January to determine if buffet style breakfasts will be permitted and continue to explore alternatives if they are not.

The last Thursday of the month the Riders normally attend an End of Month (EOM) ceremony at Leavenworth National Cemetery to honor our brothers & sisters that have passed away since last ceremony. The National Cemetery is still not allowing group activity but is allowing some support for funerals. We invite anyone to join us at this honor ceremony once this event resumes; we send out notice of staging & KSU location & times.

Again, this year ALR 407 will be adopting 3 veteran families and one single veteran. One family recently lost their veteran father/husband from the COVID-19 disease. This effort is supported by the American Legion, VFW Auxiliary, Marine Corps League, and American Legion Auxiliary. The family members give us their gift requests and in lieu of giving them a gift card for groceries for a holiday meal we collect food so they not only have a holiday meal but have food to fill their pantry.
