# Strongsville WWII Casualty Memorialized—Dennis Dimengo

The Fields of Honor Foundation is a Dutch organization that is creating an online database to commemorate all American military personnel interred in American national cemeteries in Europe. The Foundation contacted the Strongsville Historical Society in April of this year seeking information on Staff Sergeant Norris F. Neumeyer, from Strongsville, who was killed-in-action in Luxembourg on February 7, 1945, while serving as a squad leader in Company L, 318th Infantry Regiment, 80th Infantry Division.

We were able to provide the Foundation background information on Staff Sergeant Neumeyer's family, schooling, and employment as well as a photograph of him. Staff Sergeant Neumeyer was born in Strongsville on October 7, 1920. He graduated from Strongsville High School in 1938 and was a member of the football team. After graduating, he worked for Republic Steel in Cleveland. Staff Sergeant Neumeyer married Loretta M. Fredeker in 1944 before shipping out to Europe.



The Neumeyers had one son, Norris Jr. One of his brothers, Lawrence Neumeyer, also served in the Army and was the first soldier from Strongsville to be wounded-in-action in World War 2. Staff Sergeant Norris F. Neumeyer is buried in the Luxembourg American Military Cemetery. We believe he is the only soldier from Strongsville to be buried overseas.
