

## WELCOME TO ST. MARY STAR OF THE SEA PARISH

(To comply with COVID19 safety measures and for the

safety of all you are kindly asked to read and follow the

following instructions.)

## **#1 - PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS IF IN THE** LAST 14 DAYS YOU HAVE:

- Traveled internationally,
- Been exposed to a person with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID19.
- Had a new or increased shortness of breath or difficulty breathing,
- Had a new cough,
- Had at least two of the follow symptoms together; chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, vomiting, runny nose/ congestion or fatigue.

## #2 - TO ATTEND MASS KINDLY:

- Make a reservation for the Mass you wish to attend if at all possible by calling the Parish Office at 360-385-3700 before 3:30 Friday afternoon. If not, you are welcome to come even without a reservation as we now have additional seating and live streaming in the hall. There will be a 50 seat maximum capacity per Mass in the church however overflow seating is available in the Hall.
- Registering for Communion Services and Eucharistic Adoration would be appreciated as well.

## **#3 - ARRIVING AT MASS - PLAN TO ARRIVE 15-20 MINUTES EARLY TO CHECK-IN:**

- Enter the double doors nearest the rectory,
- Greeters will check you in and ushers will direct you to your seat,
- Greeters have discretion to inquire about your health,
- You are REQUIRED to wear a mask,
- Sanitation stations will be near the entrance sanitizers, masks, etc. are available,
- Social distancing of a lest 6 feet is required while on church property,
- Follow the tape arrows and directional signs,
- Donations may be placed in the small wood box as you enter the sanctuary.

## **#4 - SEATING AT MASS:**

- Only certain pews will be open and you will be directed to a pew by an usher, front to back,
- There is no guarantee you will be seated in your preferred pew or the same pew as family or friends,
- Only other people living in your dwelling and included in your reservation will be allowed to sit together,
- Please follow the tape arrows and pew partitions,
- Social distancing will be followed.

## **#5 - DURING MASS:**

- There will be no congregational singing or sign of peace,
- The only bathroom open for use is in the back of the church, if possible limit use during Mass,
- No missals or prayer pamphlets will be available. You are welcome to bring your own but please leave nothing behind in the pews.

## **#6 - COMMUNION**

- Communion will be offered during the Mass as usual,
- It will be offered only in the hand and not on the tongue with no communion cup,
- Exit church down the side aisle on Mary's side of the church,
- Bulletins for adults and children are available to the left of the door as your leave,
- As you leave church please go directly to your vehicle,
- Please refrain from congregating indoors or where others need to pass.

### The Universal **Destination of Goods** The term universal destination of goods is a difficult subject that many choose to shy away from addressing. The reason is primarily due to the widely

misunderstood theology of the concept of "universal destination of goods." The Catholic Church professes that the goods of creation are destined for all of humankind, but also acknowledges that the individual right to private property, indeed, exists and should be encouraged. Additionally, the Church appreciates that government authority has the right and duty to regulate the legitimate exercise of the right to ownership for the sake of the common good. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: The right to private property, acquired or received in a just way, does not do away with the original gift of the earth to the whole of mankind. The universal destination of goods remains primordial, even if the promotion of the common good requires respect for the right to private property and its exercise.... (2403). Goods of production – material or immaterial – such as land, factories, practical or artistic skills, oblige their possessors to employ them in ways that will benefit the greatest number. Those who hold goods for use and consumption should use them with moderation, reserving the better part for guests, for the sick and the poor (2405).

Most Catholics often find this teaching worrisome or difficult to accept. However, the principal truth is rather simple; we were not created to feather our own nests. If we expend too much of our time and resources on feathering our own nests, it interferes with our response to the One who loved us into being. For this reason alone, wouldn't it be a good thing for us to reflect on the comforts we enjoy, the plans we have for our future and the will of God for our lives?

The idea of the common good arises from the truth that God created the world and everything in it so that He might give humanity dominion over it. Therefore, as stewards, we exercise authority and protection until the Lord comes again. It is through this cooperation, that man gives glory to his Creator and, ultimately, achieves union with Him. Now, clearly God intended for all men and women to share in this dominion, not just a few. He also intended that we should share in it morally, that is, according to his Divine will, which is a manifestation of our love for our creator.

It is available in Regular Print, Large Print, Kid's Edition, Español, and in App form for your smart devices. You can order it at: https://us.magnificat.net/ or download it to your smart device. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, www.usccb.org provides daily Mass readings, an audio option and a daily video homily. Another prayer resource which you might like to consider is the Liturgy of the Hours or sometimes referred to as the Breviary. You can order a hard copy from our local Catholic Supply Store (Kaufers) or any online bookstore. It is also available as an App for your smart phones. Perhaps the most popular computer interface and App is called "Divine Office," www.divineoffice.org, as it gives the option to listen to the prayers and you have the option to see who else is praying the same prayers from their resource anywhere in the world. It is a virtual prayer community connected around the world. ### OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY

October, the month of the Rosary is a good time to reevaluate the place the Rosary has in our lives. It has the potential to transform our lives if we are willing. So where does that leave those of us who genuinely find it difficult to concentrate whilst praying the Rosary? While we can pray the Rosary to varying degrees of perfection, it is not really possible to pray

the Rosary badly. Although we should always hope that we might learn to pray the Rosary better, we are never worse off for praying it. We might have various bad attitudes that we become aware of when we pray the Rosary, but this is surely a good thing. It makes us realize how much we need God's mercy. It is through praying the Rosary that we really start to appreciate who Mary is. She is our spiritual Mother, she loves us, she constantly prays for us, gently guiding us towards her Son. So we should feel entirely comfortable and at ease in her company. As a nun, St Bernadette used to encourage the sisters to pray the Rosary whilst going to sleep and would say "you will be like a little child who falls asleep saying 'Mama, Mama!'" Pope John Paul II said that as a young man, praying the rosary helped him realize that not only does Our Holy Mother direct us towards Christ, but Christ also directs us towards His mother. Christ is saying 'look what marvels I have worked for my mother. When praying the Rosary we do not worship Mary, but rather call to mind her role in salvation history. 'Devotion to the saints and especially to Our Lady, is so important because it marks out why our faith is so special. God's grace is not something superficial, but penetrates the core of our being. God has promised to make us like Himself. Our Lady is the first in whom this promise has been fulfilled, and so she is worthy of the highest of praise.
