Positive Images Service Project #2

Let us introduce you to two men and a SIGP member who have provided computers and set up a reliable internet at Positive Images

Gordon Chan started Tech Shield 24/7 [https://ts247.com]. Tech Shield provides tech support for companies not large enough to have an IT department. The company (actually Gordon's) donated both the equipment and time to set up an original computer lab at Positive Images on Coplin and Warren streets in Detroit.

Mike Lucas, husband of **SIGP member Liz Lucas**, donated his time and talent to get the lab up and running. Now Positive Images has a reliable internet connection.

Once upon a time, Mike worked a tech job in the Detroit area. His specialty was network architecture and security. He also worked to help build the internet when it was a DARPA project before it went public in the 1990s. Now that's coming in to the 21st Century from the ground floor!

Mike ran a data center for a consulting firm that handled large local and worldwide networks. Mike hired several people for his team and Gordon Chan was one of those people.

Time moves on and since no one else was doing it, Mike wrote books about the Big System tools. He found and filled an empty niche. In the 2010s his success in publishing meant he could stop the 9-to-5 headache and write full time. He has been writing ever since. He now has well over 50 books written in addition to other publications. (https://mwl.io/)

Tech Shield 24/7 donated enough equipment for the lab at the Coplin building to create six full stations with Windows 11. These computers are exactly what you would find if you walked into any office job. Mike, along with **SIGP member Lillian Frazier** set this up in June.

Mike and Lillian have developed a working lab with stable internet access at Positive Images. Lillian identified several areas of online weaknesses that she is working on to ensure the personal safety of the clients of Positive Images.

SIGP is grateful to Gordon, Mike and Lillian for their interest and hard work in bringing Positive Images up to date. The lab will provide the organization's clients with internet access as well as the ability to practice on current computers they may find in their future workplaces. Thank you SO much!
