- □ Cold. The child may attend school if he or she is free from fever and general malaise for 48 hours. If a child has a lingering cough (a signal of an upper respiratory infection), he or she should be seen by a physician and return will require a negative COVID test.
- □ **Ringworm or Athlete's Foot**. The child may attend if the infected area is being treated for 24 hours **and** is covered.
- Strep Throat. The child may return to school after 24 hours of treatment with medication and child has no fever for 48 hours.
- □ **Conjunctivitis (pink-eye)**. The child may return to school following 24 hours of treatment with prescribed medication.
- Rash. Out of care if child has fever or until a doctor determines that it is not contagious (<u>must have a note</u> <u>from the doctor</u>). In some cases, such as Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (or other illnesses which cause blisters filled with fluid), children may not return until the blisters have stopped developing and have scabbed over, regardless of doctor's note.

All above symptoms do not assume COVID-19 as an underlying cause. If child has 2 or more symptoms, child may <u>NOT</u> return for a minimum of 10 days (at least 3 days after symptoms have subsided but no sooner than 10 days of isolation/quarantine) <u>without</u> a negative COVID-19 test.
