

Scrub-Style Chemo Caps

Use ¼" seam allowances throughout.

1. Place two wrap pieces right sides together and sew around three sides leaving the short, straight side open. It is okay if the pieces do not match exactly. Use pins to hold together.
2. Clip the curves. Turn the wrap right side out and press. Top stitch around the finished edge about ⅛ to ¼" from the edge.
3. Take one circle and fold it into quarters. Mark each quarter with a pin or marking pen/pencil.
4. Mark the unsewn side of the wrap into quarters.
5. Pin the short marked side of the wrap to the right side of the marked circle matching the quarter marks and the ends of the short side of the wrap. The circle will go from end to end of the short side of the wrap. There may be a pleat in the circle as you pin but that is fine.
6. Sew **all the way** around the circle using a scant ¼" seam.
7. Fold the wrap in toward the center of the circle you just sewed and place the 2nd circle on top of the folded wrap circle right sides together. Pin the two circles together with the folded wrap between them leaving about a two inch space to turn inside out when done sewing. Keep the wrap away from the edges of the circle where you will be sewing. It will look like a ravioli.
8. Sew around the circle on the side where you can see the first row of stitching. Sew inside of the 1st row of stitching. This way the stitching will not show on the outside. Don't forget to leave about a two inch opening for turning.
9. Turn right side out.
10. Press under the opening and edge stitch around the wrap and the circle. This will close the opening.

When you print the pattern pages, the width of the "wrap" piece at the fold line should be about 6½". If it is not very close to that measurement, make sure that "Page Scaling" on the "Print Dialog Box" is set to "None". Once you have printed the pattern pages, cut and tape the wrap pieces together, matching A to A and B to B.
