## FIREWISE LANDSCAPES

Build defensible space around your home.

*More fire resistant plants* share characteristics. They often:

- \* have a higher moisture content in their leaves
- \* have little seasonal buildup of dead vegetation
- \* have low, compact growth form
- \* are high in soap or salt content
- \* have green stems
- \* are drought tolerant



*Less fire resistant plants* typically share one or more of the following characteristics. They often:

- \* are water-stressed
- \* accumulate fine, twiggy, dry, or dead material
- \* are evergreen
- \* have stiff, leathery, small, or fine, lacy leaves
- \* have loose or papery bark
- \* will flame when preheated ignited with a match
- \* retain low-growing branches even as they become shaded
