 - * Discussion about <u>posting literature prices and order form on the website</u>. Motion made at July Intergroup meeting to eblast the AA Groups on island in time so they could discuss at their business meetings and send their Groups' votes to the August Intergroup meeting. That eblast did not happen. Motion made to not post the prices on the website. Only two Groups had discussed this over the last month and voted on it: one for, one against. Request that Groups discuss and bring votes to the September meeting. The issue(s): seven years ago the literature chair did not want the prices online, because 1 some O'ahu AAers might wonder why Kaua'i's prices are lower: A1- Kaua'i does not have to pay for office space, insurance, utilities, etc literature is stored in climate-controlled locker no mold! so literature does not need to be marked up to help pay for office expenses. 2 – Kaua'i Intergroup might be liable to pay GE Tax. **A** - JoRina contacted the State, and the State of Hawai'i exempted Kaua'i Intergroup, because Kaua'i AA Groups pool their money to buy literature at a discount and shipping cost savings, and pass those savings onto the AA Groups and members on Kaua'i by not marking up the literature, not generating a profit.

More discussion also followed re amending the Intergroup ByLaws to address bringing a motion forward and the voting process. From the Kaua'i Intergroup ByLaws:

6. Amendments

These bylaws may be amended at any time by a two thirds majority vote of the group representatives present at any regular meeting of Intergroup, provided a copy of the proposed amendment has been submitted to each group at least thirty days before the meeting at which action is to be taken on the amendment.

Chair Susan On stated the voting process is addressed in the Service Manual. (Preparer's note: Area 17's <u>Structures and Guidelines</u> details their process of amending policy or procedure in Section 9; and <u>Section 10</u> provides detailed <u>Guidelines for Discussion</u> – worth the reading.)
