OPERATIONS

Summer is officially here, and Don and his team have done a great job of sprucing up all the common areas with fresh mulch. The pond at the clubhouse needs some more attention. That will be addressed in the next week or so to get the pump working properly and to clean up the back side a little better.

The tree program is complete for this year except for a few trees that need trimming, and we will be looking into to what extent we can do more with tree maintenance in the future. Medvil does its best to eliminate pine trees from shading homes in the winter and to add deciduous trees to shade homes in the summer. Many of the maples that were planted in front of homes in the early days of our community are close to the road and have roots that are starting to interfere with roads and foundations. Those that are posing a threat will likely be replaced with species that don't grow so large, to ensure that the beauty of our community is maintained.

The Bocci Court is refinished and ready for the summer players. Several drainage issues have been addressed with several more still in the works, the bigger projects done by an outside contractor.

Quotes are being gathered for the materials needed for the replacement of the glass slider doors at the Partridge Lane Clubhouse with windows that will reduce the cost of energy for the clubhouse. That project will begin in the next few weeks. As that project gets started, we could use some volunteer help if you can swing a hammer. As the saying goes, "many hands make for light work." Let me know if you can spare some time this summer. For those who have submitted work orders, you can attest that most are done within a day or two as Don is running a very efficient schedule even with the lack of a full-time assistant. We still are looking for that full time position without any applicants to date, so if you hear of anyone with the skill set of snowplowing and handyman skills, send them our way.

The flag retirement ceremony went very well this year with a few sprinkles but that didn't spoil the event. A couple residents brought their grandchildren which was a great education for them while a few even learned how to properly fold our national emblem. Thanks much to Bob Blais and Rich Marchand, who also participated in making this a great educational event.

That's it for this month, enjoy your summer and watch for the announcement of Bocci Ball games coming soon.

TASTY TIDBITS by Cat Pragoff

Summer is here at last, and now it's time for salads—and lots of them. And maybe a few goodies on the grill, too. Here are a selection for you to choose from for the upcoming holiday, as well as to enjoy for the rest of the season. Have fun!

Black Bean and Corn Salad (makes 6 servings)

Ingredients:

1/4 cup olive oil

1/3 cup fresh lime juice

1 clove garlic, minced

1 tsp. salt

1/8 tsp. ground cayenne pepper

- 2 (15 ounce) cans black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1-1/2 cups frozen corn kernels
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped
- 2 tomatoes, chopped
- 6 green onions, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup fresh cilantro, chopped

Directions:

- In a small lidded jar, mix the olive oil, lime juice, garlic, salt, and cayenne pepper. Cover and shake the jar well until the dressing is thoroughly mixed.
- In a salad bowl, combine the beans, corn, bell pepper, tomatoes, and green onion.
- Give the dressing another good shake, then pour over the salad.
- Top the salad with the cilantro and mix well. Serve.

Watermelon Cucumber Salad (makes 16 servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 cups seedless watermelon, cubed
- 2 English cucumbers, halved lengthwise and sliced6 green onion, sliced thinly
- 1/4 cup fresh mint, minced1/4 cup balsamic vinegar

1/4 cup olive oil

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper

Directions:

- In a small bowl, whisk together the vinegar, olive oil, salt and pepper. Set aside.
- In a salad bowl, combine the watermelon, cucumbers, green onion and mint.
- Pour the dressing over the fruit. Serve immediately or can be chilled, covered, for up to 2 hours in the refrigerator.
- For added zest, toss in a handful of feta cheese before serving.

Chickpea Garden Salad (Makes 4 servings)

Ingredients:

1 tsp. cumin seeds

1/2 cup chopped tomato

1/2 cup lemon juice

1/2 cup olive oil

1 clove garlic, minced

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper

1-1/2 cups canned chickpeas, rinsed and drained

2 medium carrots, julienned

2 small zucchinis, julienned

4 scallions, thinly sliced

1 cup parsley, coarsely chopped

1/2 cup radishes, thinly sliced

1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese

6 Tbs. chopped walnuts

6 cups spring salad mix

Directions:

- To start the dressing, in a dry skillet, toast cumin seeds over medium heat, stirring frequently until aromatic. Transfer to a small bowl and stir in tomato, lemon juice, olive oil, garlic, salt, and cayenne pepper.
- In a medium bowl, combine chickpeas, carrots, zucchini, scallions, parsley, radishes, cheese, and walnuts. Stir in 2/3 cup of the dressing.
- To serve, divide salad mix onto 4 plates, top with chickpea mixture and drizzle with remaining dressing.

Grilled Peaches and Berries (makes 6 servings)

Ingredients:

6 medium ripe peaches, halved and pitted

2 cups fresh blueberries

4 Tbs. brown sugar

4 Tbs. butter

2 Tbs. lemon juice

Directions:

• Place two peach halves, cut side up, on three double layers of heavy duty foil. Top with blueberries, sugar, butter and lemon juice.

- Fold foil around peach mixture and seal tightly.
- Grill over medium-low heat for 18-20 minutes or until tender. Be careful when opening foil to allow steam to escape.

Most people know that when you dial 911 from your home phone, the enhanced computer screen shows the caller's name, address, and telephone number. Most people don't know, however, that your telephone number is technically known as ANI (Automatic Number Identification) and the location of the phone (aka your address) is known as ALI (Automatic Location Identification).

New Hampshire 911 has the unique ability to add supplemental or additional information about permanent medical conditions or hazardous materials specific to YOUR location or address. Perhaps the most overlooked 'enhancement' of New Hampshire's 911 system is the 911 CARES database.

Here's how it works:

- 911 maintains this database which is separate from the 911 database. This special database is reserved for permanent medical conditions and hazardous materials on site.
- It is driven by the customer's phone number(s).
- If a customer wanted to add information to the database, they would fill out the 911 CARES form. The form asks for the customer's name, address, telephone number(s) and either the permanent medical condition (described in a few brief words) or the hazardous material information associated with the customer's address.
- Once the form goes through the appropriate processing steps, the information is entered into the database.
- From that point forward, if a 911 call were to be placed from that customer's telephone, this supplemental information will pop up on the 911 EMDs screen and they will pass this important information along to the local responders.

If you or one of your family members has a permanent medical condition or if you have hazardous/dangerous materials (such as bottled oxygen) at your home that you would like entered into the 911 CARES database, please join us on August 9th. You'll be able to sit down with a representative from GPD who will go over the program and assist you in completing the necessary enrollment forms.

The program is FREE but we are asking folks to sign up. Call the office at 603-497-4440.


If you are unable to attend, you'll find forms in the mail room at the DDCH.

Summer is here and with it comes **STINKY GARBAGE CANS!!**

PLEASE WASH OUT YOUR GARBAGE CANS.

It's easy...turn them on their side, hose them out, add bleach, swirl the bleach around inside the can, hose them out again and let them air dry. If you don't have bleach, any household cleaner will do.

And you know what keeps maggots out of your garbage cans? Moth balls!! You can buy them at Walmart and just toss a packet into bottom of a CLEAN garbage can.
