

# Appalachian Trail: West Virginia / Virginia Border

October 14 - 15, 2017

On Friday the 13th everyone arrived unafraid at the Troop cabin for the meeting and brought with them everything they planned to bring on the hike the next day. We checked all of the equipment and packed the backpacks with our personal gear, clothes, group food, and group equipment. By the end of the meeting, all of the backpacks were ready, complete with filled water bottles for the next day's hike. On average each person's pack weighed about 30 pounds.

During the meeting we assigned hiking crews, crew leaders, and cook crews. All together 48 people signed up for the trip. Because so many people planned to go, the group would be broken into smaller hiking groups of 8 - 10, so we would not crowd other hikers on the trail.

On Saturday morning we arrived at the Troop cabin at 6:00AM sharp and packed the bus with all of the backpacks. After this we began the 3 hour bus ride to our put-in points on the Appalachian Trail. There would be two different hikes. The long hike began on Virginia Route 7 south of Harpers Ferry, WV, and hiked north 7.5 miles to the campsite with lots of ups and downs. The many ups and downs have been nicknamed by other hikers "The Rollercoaster". The maximum incline was 700 feet and after 4 major mountain ups, we reached the ridge. The ridge was mostly flat and we had to hike another 3 miles to the campsite. The total elevation gain was 2200ft. The Rollercoaster was a 3.5 mile hike. By the time we reached the ridge we were all very tired. The short hike began on West Virginia Route 9 with a somewhat flatter trail, and hiked south, and it was 6 miles to the campsite. After we all got to the campsite, which was in the middle of the two hikes, we set up camp and cooked a delicious freeze-dried dinner.

On Sunday we woke up early at 6AM sharp. We made oatmeal and hot chocolate for breakfast. Surprisingly we had brought more food than we needed for the trip. After breakfast and camp take-down, we began the 6 miles out to the trail exit on Route 9. The bus ride back was relaxing because we all got to sleep.

**US Military Academy tour, football game and camping trip: November 10 – 12, 2017**

Here's hoping that you got your paperwork in for the Troop's November 10 – 12<sup>th</sup> trek to the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY. It promises to be a great trip!

We will be staying at the Frederick Lake campground on the outskirts of the West Point campus. Emphasis will be placed on setting up camp quickly, as we will rise and shine early in the morning to eat a quick breakfast, put on our Class A uniforms, and head over to the Academy. There, we will tour the grounds as we are escorted by an USMA student. This part of the trip is always fun, as the cadets come from all across the US. There are even students visiting from the other US armed service academies as part of an exchange program and in some cases we will see exchange students from the military academies of US allies around the globe.

The pageantry continues with a plethora of military-themed activities. In past visits, we have seen Army helicopters land on the parade grounds, and soldiers dressed in full battle gear have demonstrated their prowess for the crowd. Saturday of our trip will be Veterans Day, so we will likely see many high-ranking Army officers in attendance as the crowd salutes those who have served our country. All of this will be followed by the Parade of Cadets as the "Corps" marches into Michie Stadium to watch Army take on Duke. A paratrooper typically delivers the game ball to the Army football captains right at the 50 yard line. It doesn't get any better than this!

We are honored to have many military veterans associated with Troop 78. # Vermont Ski Trip

March 9 - 11, 2018

## Have You Heard the News? Troop 78 Will Be Skiing in Vermont!

Wax up your skis or snowboard and fluff up that down jacket, because Troop 78 is heading to Vermont in March!

With the arrival of our new bus this Scouting year, the Troop has been able to travel farther in comfort. So this year we are teaming up with the Buck Ridge Ski Club, a local ski club that has its own lodge a mile from Mount Snow, Vermont. Buck Ridge will be renting the lodge to Troop 78 for the weekend of March 9 – 11, 2018.

The Lodge has three separate bunk rooms, two full kitchens, a large dining room, and multiple bathrooms. There is a large common area with a propane-fueled fireplace. We will have plenty of room to enjoy our meals and prepare for our runs on Mount Snow. Mt. Snow has a peak height of 3,600 feet and a vertical drop of 1,700 feet. The mountain has trails for experts, intermediates and beginners alike. We will be arranging for lift tickets and ski/board packages for any attendees who need to get gear to enjoy the slopes.

The best part of this trip is that each father who comes on the trip will get a family membership in the Buck Ridge Ski Club. Membership benefits are outlined on the Club's website, but one of the big perks is that members can use the lodge year-round for a modest overnight fee. The lodge backs up to Vermont's Long Trail, so it's ideal for hikers. It's a 2 minute drive to Mount Snow and it's close to other ski areas in southern Vermont as well.

For any adult over the age of 18 who would like to get the Buck Ridge Ski Club membership now, please download the membership form from the Club's website and mail the form and payment to the address noted at the Club website. Then, when we have sign-ups for the trip, simply include a copy of your membership and we will apply the membership fee against the charges you would otherwise be required to pay for the ski trip.

Think Snow! It's not too early. Mount Snow will be open by Thanksgiving, so get your family membership to Buck Ridge Ski Club now! The membership offer is open to all Troop 78 members and their friends.
