It is with a heavy heart that I write this letter. I am writing to inform you that I am leaving Psychiatric Care and Research Center.

I have decided to embark on a new journey. As many of you know, my wife and I have three adult children who have moved on to start lives of their own. Unfortunately, none of them have decided to continue to call St. Louis home. Because of this, we have decided to move closer to our son who lives in Seattle.

This will be a big move for us! We did not expect to make this move but opportunities for my wife and myself presented themselves and made this decision possible. My wife has found a position with a practice in Seattle to continue her work as a Reproductive Endocrinologist. As for me, I have accepted a position with an Interventional Psychiatric practice where I will act as Medical Director.

We will be moving to Seattle this summer, making my last day here at PCRC May 30, 2025. The team here at PCRC has hired a Nurse Practitioner to take over my patients.
