Aloha Kakou,

The one thing I cannot fathom is how 340,000+ Americans could be dead from the novel coronavirus. All alive just a mere twelve months ago. In my October newsletter I marveled at 200,000 dead. Now ... I am at a loss for words.

This should not have been. Many of these deaths could have been prevented. But they were not.

The old norms, the old ways of doing and being human, are dead and gone, too. Social behaviors – like dining out, going to church, school and work are changed forever. The way we travel the globe is changed forever. How we understand our place in God's creation is changed forever.

What we formed has been deformed. Utterly deformed – familiar, recognizable but not. And now, at the same time it is still deforming, we are taking next steps in reforming. There are no magic pills, no silver bullets, no quick fixes that will allow us to "go back to normal." I am always surprised when I hear people say, "When things get back to normal." After almost one hundred twenty 9/11s this year, we gotz no "normal" to go back to. But we are taking next steps together.

Formation, deformation, reformation. We are the Church of the Reformation. Always on the move, creating. Always questioning, doubting. Always crucifying, dying. Always resurrecting, recreating. As such we just may have something to offer people as they grieve, mourn, and weep for loved ones and our nolonger-sacred way of life. We can speak "Jesus" – that is, live by grace in Christ who was formed at Christmas and his Baptism, deformed by his arrest, torture and crucifixion, and reformed at his resurrection and ascension.

We are the Church of the Reformation, with something to offer: faith, hope, and love through the Crucified Christ. God is Immanuel, with us, forming, deforming and reforming. Birthing, crucifying, and resurrecting.

Christmas Blessings as we stagger into the New Year.






The same is true for *Christ in Our Home*, a daily devotion booklet that is issued every 3 months. Here again, we always have extras in the office. Just let us know if you are interested.




The Power of Prayer
