1. All Nursing Staff must have Shift Changes.
2. Night shift workers get double time pay.
3. One night of about 12 hours can be two days of work.
4. All these Nurses are paid their full salary, transportation costs, uniform allowance and maintenance at their choice of places, retirement, medical benefits, and all other union worker benefits.
5. A Unionized "Personal Nursing Care Administration" must be in place to begin training of those who want to work in this career beginning immediately, now. This Personal Nursing Care Administration will also do the hiring, administer the pay and benefits, and select trainees from various locations. This Administration must be in all Towns, Cities, and Rural areas.

This Administration will also have their own fleet of vehicles and drivers for patient transportation to and from medical appointments when they are needed for the elderly and those who are sick.

The Administration can also contract with another vehicle operator who already has a fleet of GOOD vehicles, know the local addresses, and will become a subsidiary of the Administration, be trained by the organization and carry the Administration's name.

6. The Personal Nursing Care Administration will be given its own Frank or Mint currency machine to create cash money to use for all expenses including pay and benefits and overhead expenses.
7. No elderly or sick person is to pay for these services; they are entitled to it.
8. Training must begin now for all those who want to become a Level 1 Nurse.
9. All Central Jamaica Home Health Aide, Nurse Aide, Nursing Assistants, Caregiver, Personal Care Aide, Personal Care Attendant, Personal Care Assistant, Companion Care Provider Nurses must know procedural skills such as checking vital signs; hygiene skills: bathing, dressing, Infection control, maintaining clean surroundings for their patients, positioning, range of motion exercises, storing supplies to be used by patient and caregiver. Their focus is to give direct care to the patients and using basic nursing skills; automated external defibrillator practice, CPR/First Aid, give timely medications; excellent patience, good communication skills, interpersonal skills, teamwork and diversity skills, simple math, nutrition, meal preparation, the art of caregiving, feeding, walking, proper body mechanics, using safety, Techniques for moving and ambulating patients, Proper client writing and reporting, and Anatomy and Physiology.
10. For automated external defibrillator practice (AED), Cardiopulmonary resuscitation, (CPR) and First Aid continuing development, all first year Nurse Level 1 is required to get continuing education in this area every four months after completion of the program of study. After the first year, these topics have continuing development every six months at no cost to the worker or student. The entire duration of the three topics should not last more than one hour, and the worker get two times their hourly rate.

11. Through lectures, hands-on/on-site, DVDs, role-playing, laboratory practice, and audio-video training, students learn procedural skills such as vital signs, bathing, dressing, positioning, and so on. The classroom is equipped with hospital beds and medical equipment to practice skills prior to the clinical rotation.
12. With an emphasis on academics and hands-on skills training, graduates of this Nurse Level 1 program are well prepared for the requirements to be successfully employed in hospitals, long-term HouseCare and home physical care settings.
13. Hours of training is from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM and three consecutive days. The total hours per week for this training, is no more than 16 hours including lunch.
14. Each topic can last 55 minutes. Some classes depending on the topic can last two hours with a 10 minutes Essence break. A 10 minutes break is given between two consecutive topics. A total of 20 minutes essence break per day.
15. If a student misses a class, he or she can have flexible time to do the makeup within the 8 to 10 weeks. If an emergency occurs, the student may need to join the next school term if he or she will be absent for more than one week.
16. The course prepares students to seek employment in various physical care settings, including skilled nursing house, hospice care, board and care/retirement house, rehabilitation hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, and day care house for the elderly.
17. Course Length 8 to 10 weeks including two weeks of hands on training in one of the above nursing care settings. They will develop their skills with clinical rotations, which gives them hands-on experience working directly with patients in a physical care setting. During this time, they will be supervised by a Level 2 or 3 Nurse or a Nurse Training Instructor.
18. The minimum salary per year for full-time employment for a Nurse Level One (1) only in Jamaica is \$190,000.00 US (one hundred and ninety thousand). This is effective since the year 2000.
19. All Jamaicans who are Nurse Aide, Home Health Aide, Nursing Assistants, Caregiver, Personal Care Aide, Personal Care Attendant, Personal Care Assistant, Companion Care Provider and live outside the State of Jamaica West Indies, also get this salary with effect from the year 2000.
20. For employment, this Nurse Level 1 job is 80 percent Angie/Woman and 20 percent Ban/Man.
21. Qualification for Nurse Level 1: Read, write, and understand
22. At graduation, they will receive: Nurse Level 1 Diploma
23. The cost of the care and maintenance of good physical care of all Jamaicans, and living good in all ways, are the responsibility of the physical Earth.
