Motion by Wolfe, second by Gansen to approve agenda. Ayes: all, carried. Consent agenda consisted of October 2025 claims, 10/20/2025, 11/10/2024 minutes, October 2025 Treasurer’s Report, Building permit 2025-1428 307 2<sup>nd</sup> St NE (Lueck) solar panels. Motion by Lueck, second by Gansen to approve consent agenda. Ayes: all, carried. G. Langel asked if there was a legal agreement between the city and Bard Concrete on damage to the streets done by trucks going through town from the sand pit being built outside of town. The council responded there was no such formal agreement. Jeff Simon and Nancy Dunkel presented information regarding Dyersville Area Community foundation, including how it works, what it supports and how to donate if interested in helping communities with their needs. The council thanked the foundation for their work and the grants our community has received in the past. A. Stelken with Kluesner Sanitation discussed extending their contract for 5 years and the costs and services associated with that contract. Council reviewed Fehr Graham estimate on a storm water study for the east side of town. Council will table until a decision is made on what projects they will be doing in the future and to what extent these projects will progress. City has received the new truck and have sold the pick up and dump truck. Vendor event held at the end of Nov was a success with \$650.00 raised for community projects. Santa and Mrs. Clause will be at the Memorial Hall on Sat Dec 13<sup>th</sup> from 10:30 until noon. Thank you to the Fire Department for offering to drive Santa that day. Motion by Sheehy, second by Gansen to pay Athletic Assoc \$400.00 for electricity used for storing and cooling beer. All Ayes, motion carried. Clerk will publish notice of intent to appoint for Mayor since both of the top two write ins (C. Smock and G. Langel) declined the position. Council will vote to appoint a Mayor at the Dec 15<sup>th</sup> meeting. Anyone wanting to be considered for the position must file a request in writing to the city clerk before the meeting.
