What to do if you do not have access to the internet

This may apply to you if:

- you do not have a hot spot and are waiting on one from the school
- you lose internet service (for any reason)
- other

Your options are the following:

- Your student can use a phone to access Google Classroom and Google Meet and Edgenuity
 - I know this isn't ideal, but for a short time, this will work.
- Your student can go to one of the <u>places listed</u> with free wifi to access the internet
 - Students can access their teachers Google Classroom for a video of what was taught that day, so they can stay caught up with the class if they need to access free wifi during times other than school hours.
 - This is a temporary solution (we expect no more than a week). Your student will have to email their teachers each day/evening to let them know they watched the video, turn in the work assigned that day, and to stay current with the lessons.
- You can ask a friend who has internet if they would like some company for a week in the evenings, so you can visit while your student accesses their classes online.
- They can choose to go to the semester long choice for Edgenuity, and then access the internet at whatever time is convenient for your family. This, then, does not tie them to school hours.
- If your student qualifies for free or reduced lunch prices, you can use the letter mailed to you by September 3rd, 2020 stating this to qualify for a reduced wifi fee.
 You can take the letter to COX COMMUNICATIONS to get \$10/month wifi installed in your home.
