### SCHOOL ROUTINES

Morning Drop-Off: Children are welcome in classrooms at 8:55am. Please do not drop your child off before 8:55 am as teachers are still preparing for the day.

Handwashing at Morning Drop-Off: All children are to be taken to the bathroom by a caregiver to have their hands washed upon arriving at school and before entering their classroom. This simple task cuts down on the transmission of germs and allergens and keeps everyone healthier.

**Pick-up Times:** Please be prompt when picking up your child at the end of the school day. We allow for a 10 minute grace period, but after that time, your child will be waiting in the office for you to pick them up. You may be charged a late fee if you are chronically late to pick up your child.

## HEARING, SPEECH & OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCREENINGS

Classroom observations, ASQs, and parent requests are used to recommend a Speech or Occupational Therapy screening to help determine if a child's skills are age appropriate. BHPCNS works with experts in our area to conduct Speech and OT screenings twice a year and Vision and Hearing screenings once a year. These screenings are all provided at no additional cost to parents. BHPCNS feels strongly that early intervention can have an enormous positive impact on a child's immediate and long-term development.

The Speech and Occupational Therapy Screenings, while a snapshot in time, help BHPCNS identify whether a child's skills are age-appropriate, should be reassessed in 6 months, or should be examined more comprehensively. BHPCNS does not receive compensation for referrals made to outside organizations for more comprehensive assessments. We value the feedback from screenings and assessments and use this information to make adjustments to our programming to better meet the needs of every child in our program.

Teachers and parents may recommend students for speech and OT screenings. A signed permission slip will be required for all speech and OT screenings. Many of the screenings are recommended rescreens from those completed this past fall.



## Ages\*\* Children enrolled in our 2, 3, and Pre-K programs are invited to attend (as well as, recent BHPCNS graduates).



Campers will be served a mid-morning snack provided by BHPCNS. Campers bring a lunch from home.



Early Drop-off: Campers may be dropped off at 8:00 am for an additional \$150 per camp session. Drop-in rate is \$20/day. Light snack provided by BHPCNS.

Stay & Play: Campers may stay until 2:30 pm for an additional \$280 per camp session. Drop-in rate is \$35/day. Light snack provided by BHPCNS.

\*An additional \$85 fee for any child who is not fully toilet trained. BHPCNS considers a child fully potty-trained when the child is able to articulate their need to go to the bathroom, can manage their clothing, and does not have recurring accidents at school.

\*\* Must be currently enrolled at BHPCNS for the 24-25 school year and two by December 31, 2024.

# MCPS Kindergarten Registration Has Begun!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in late August. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until late August the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall

## PRE-WRITING SKILLS

From NAEYC, the National Association for the Education of Young Children, <u>4 Tips Every Kindergarten Teacher Wants You to Know</u>

Pre-writing skills are the lines and strokes kids need to master and know BEFORE learning how to print the alphabet. Each of these lines are developed in a sequence, based on how old the child is.

This developmental sequence is:

- Vertical Line Age 2 imitates, age 3 copies/masters
- Horizontal Line Age 2 1/2 imitates, age 3 copies/masters
- Circle Shape Age 2 1/2 imitates, age 3 copies/masters
- Cross Shape (+) Age 3 1/2 imitates, age 4 copies/masters
- Square Shape Age 4
- Right/Left Diagonal Line Age 4 1/2
- X Shape Age 5
- Triangle Age 5

Fun Ways to Work on Pre-Writing Skills

Since the typical age for children working on pre-writing lines is ages 2-5, it is a good idea to focus on fine motor skills that promote learning these lines and shapes instead of using paper and pencils/crayons. Your child will need the fine motor strength these activities provide in order to have good pre-writing lines and later good letter formations. Activities to try at home:



## ART (all ages) SCIENCE (3-year-olds and Pre-K) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese

In March our artists will make prints. They will practice transferring images from found objects onto a sheet of paper. Each edition is a group of identical prints made from the same surface but I am willing to bet no two prints we make will be identical.

Our scientists will help ready our garden for Spring. We will plant seeds, learn about the germination process, and talk about plants:

- How plants produce the oxygen we breathe.
- How plants remove carbon dioxide from the air.
- How plants provide food for animals and humans.
- How plants help cool the earth.
- How plants provide habitats for wildlife.

We will care for these seeds over the next few weeks and when the weather turns warmer plant our seedlings in our children's garden.
