

REGULAR MEETING
TOWN OF DELCAMBRE
MAY 13, 2019

Town of Delcambre regular session convened at 6:00 p.m. on MAY 13, 2019, at the City Hall, with Mayor Pam Blakely, presiding.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Members present: Alderman Bryan Glatter, Alderman Donald Martin, Alderwoman Madison Saunier and Alderwoman Sarah Trahan.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Alderman Timothy Derise

ALSO, PRESENT: Town Clerk Shirley Wyles, Town Attorney Ted Ayo, Fire Chief Brock Benoit, Street Commissioner Homer Stelly, Pelican Waste representative Tommy Thibodeaux, Vermilion Parish Sheriff Mike Couvillion, and 7 guests.

MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "moved to accept and dispense the minutes of the regular meeting of APRIL 2019 as reviewed." Motion Carried:

MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to authorize payment of monthly bills as reviewed." Motion Carried:

DISCUSSION: Sellers & Associates representative, Larry Cramer, reports the Water Meter construction is going as schedule with no major complications found. Installation of meters has begun and the Town needs to have all home owners sign the Water User Agreements after review and approval by members of the Council and Mayor.

MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to approve Water Meter User Agreement as presented by Town Attorney, Ted Ayo". Motion Carried.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Ayo and Alderman Glatter introduced into discussion the proposed RV ordinance and made grammatical and data entry corrections. All members agree on the corrections and feel the ordinance is needed and to move forward. Introduction to Ordinance is scheduled for public hearing on June 10, 2019 at 5:50PM.

DISCUSSION: Introduced by Mayor Blakely. Vermilion Parish Sheriff, Michael "Mike" Couvillion discussed the achievements of the Sheriff's department during his current term have been a positive move forward for the Parish with having 35 active officers and monitoring with 40 boat rescues. Sheriff Couvillion has goals for his next elected term, which include purchasing body cams for the protection of the people. Sheriff Couvillion respectfully requests Delcambre's support in the upcoming October 12th election.

Introduction of Amending Ordinance 5-90, 5-91, & 5-92 scheduled for public hearing on Jun 10, 2019 5:50PM". Motion Carried.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier, "moved to approve and issue permission statements for the sale of Alcohol to Twin Parish Port Commission for the event of "Marina Day" scheduled for June 13, 2019." Motion Carried.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to approve the sales of alcohol for Skip & Ria's at the Delcambre Volunteer Fire Department's "Battle for the Paddle" event scheduled for June 8, 2019". Motion Carried.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderwoman Madison Saunier and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to approve road blocks at President Street at Richard Street for the Delcambre Volunteer Fire Department's "Battle for the Paddle" event scheduled for June 8, 2019". Motion Carried.
- MOTION: Introduced by Alderman Timothy Derise and seconded by Alderwoman Madison Saunier "Moved to approve an increase the security light fee as assessed on each customer utility billing; The monthly service fee increase of fifty cents (.50) per month will begin June 1st 2019". Motion Carried.
- MOTON: Introduced by Alderman Donald Martin and seconded by Alderwoman Sarah Trahan "moved to amend ordinance - **CUSTOMER SECURITY/STREET LIGHT FEE INCREASE** Sec. 13-13. Street lighting declared a public utility; service charge; definition.
(a) The furnishing by the town of street lights is hereby declared to be a revenue producing public utility.
(b) In order to provide for the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Town of Delcambre, there is hereby levied a service charge to defray the expenses of street lights, to be assessed and collected monthly, as follows:
(1) Upon each owner of a residence \$3.00
(2) Upon each owner of an apartment building, per apartment 3.00
(3) Upon each commercial establishment 3.00
(c) For the purposes of this section, the word "apartment" shall be construed to mean a living or residential unit containing usual and ordinary kitchen facilities.
