## **Financial Report:**

Giselle will check with Miki about the anonymous donation to make sure we received it and record it properly

Constant Contact and Event Keeper were not included in Lee Ann's wish list. Kate will confirm that Lee Ann will cover theses costs in the library's budget.

Michael motioned to accept the financial report Amity seconded Motion passed

Kate presented wording for our dedication. It will say "Given by the Friends of the Sharon Public Library"

- 2) Tina Cassidy Book Talk on her book *Mr. President, How Long Must We Wait?* on 4/23 at 7 pm. Sponsored by the Friends and LWV. Friends will bake for this one.

We all have flyers and should post around town.

#### Valentine's Day Fundraiser:

Elizabeth will work with Sweethearts Three Fine Chocolates on how to track orders. Joanne suggested that they can either 1) put a note section on the PayPal form so people can enter a code or 2) create a new PayPal button and link that we could email members and post on flyers.

# Basket fundraising:

We cannot sell raffle tickets online and library staff cannot sell tickets. We decided to try raffling off a valentine's themed basket. We thought we could sell raffle tickets at our February 13<sup>th</sup> speaker event and at the library on Saturdays leading up to the event. Amity will ask Lee Ann when the library (upstairs and downstairs) is busiest (maybe we don't need to be there all day) and if there is any other programming event in early February that we could attend to sell raffle tickets.

Amity agreed to manage basket creation. Kate gave Amity a basket with some valentine themed items. Giselle has mints to donate. Amity will seek out more items for the basket. Everyone should check their houses for any other items we could include.

We decided to charge \$3.00 per ticket or 2 for \$5.00

Carolyn will provide cash box

### Book Sale:

Kate spoke with Shaw's about donating reusable bags. Shaw's says they can donate 10¢ reusable plastic bags (made from recycled material). Joanne has contacted Sustainable Sharon to see if these would be okay.

Kate will bring the banners to be updated. Joanne will ask Kirstin who printed the lawn sign stickers. (Post meeting update: Signorama does both the banner and stickers so Kate will order both).

### Town-wide mailing:

Joanne provided pricing costs from printer. They want to charge \$1,330 to stuff, seal and sort the envelopes. The envelopes have to be sorted in a specific delivery order for post office. Printer says that he could tell us how to prepare the mailing if we want to do this ourselves. We decided to not print the return envelope this year since most people renew online, at the booksale, or drop off form at the library

Carolyn will ask Millie who the COA uses to print their mailings and how they are prepared.

Joanne will ask Lee Ann to confirm when we can move-in the tables for sorting. She will also ask if DPW can help move the tables from/to Nancy's house. Joanne will also ask Nancy when we can pick up the tables from her house and return them to her house.

Next time we will discuss if we want to accept textbooks and sell them to a reseller prior to the sale.

We agreed to purchase a gift card for Gary, but nothing for staff.

Director's and Trustees update: Lee Ann and trustees held a meeting with neighbors to the new library
