The facility accepts clean green materials suitable for composting such as; lawn clippings, leaves, garden waste and limbs.

The facility does not accept; processed wood, household waste, animal waste, or kitchen waste.

The facility is open to anyone in the southeast Spokane county and the following fees apply;

\$5.00 Minimum for any materials ½ yard or less.

\$7.50 per yard or any materials over ½ a yard.

No Commercial Haulers

Please be aware that burning for any purpose other than a recreational fire pit is not allowed in Rockford Town limits at any time. This is a regulation imposed by the Spokane Regional Clean Air Agency.
