July Reflection

John 4:14-15 "[Jesus said] Those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life. The woman said to him, 'Sir give me this water so that I may never be thirsty."

Y'all it is hot, as Crystal's granny would say, "It's hotter than Helen's beauty shop outside." The heat can be unrelenting, and I'm willing to bet that if you have spent any time outside this summer, you have found yourself wanting a nice cold glass of water. Is there anything more wonderful than that first sip of cold water, when you can almost feel the coolness go throughout your body.

Early on in the Gospel of John, John tells us about a time when Jesus and his disciples went into a Samaritan village. At some point Jesus gets away from the disciples, and makes his way to Jacob's well. Jesus is just sitting by the well, when a Samaritan woman makes her way to the well. Now it was noon which means the sun was at it's hottest, and no one should be going to get water. Typically you would get water in the morning or at night.

But this woman goes in the middle of the day, because she knows no one will be at the well. This poor woman is somewhat of the town pariah, been married six times, and now is living with a man who she is not married to. She doesn't want to deal with the sideway glances she will gladly take the heat of the day over the heat of her peers.

On this day though, the well is not abandoned, there is a man sitting there. I'm willing to bet that she half thought about just turning around, but she had come so far, and she needed the water. As she approached the man he called out to her, she was shocked people didn't typically talk to her, but when he speaks she also realizes, he isn't a Samaritan! He is an Israelite!

The more they talk the more she is drawn in by Jesus talking to her about living water. Until finally she says, "I know a Messiah is coming called the Christ" and Jesus says "I am he." Wouldn't you know it this town pariah, who was going to get water in the heat of the day so that she could avoid everyone's glances runs back to her village, and says, "Come and see this man who told me everything, I think he is the Messiah." The whole town of Sychar comes to believe in Jesus right then and there. She came to the well looking for a drink, she left with a renewed soul.

A few years ago Crystal's brother gave us a rafting trip on the French Broad River in Asheville. I'm sure you have all seen the French Broad River, so you know that there aren't any big rapids on the river, truthfully it is more like a giant lazy river.

But as we came to the end of our ride down the river our raft became high-centered on a rock and that little river that had not seemed intimidating several minutes before started to pour into our raft. At first we started to try and bail out the water, but the harder we tried to bail, the more the water flowed into the raft. Some of the people in the raft began to panic and our cool and collected raft guide started to get a little scarred. She tried to move the raft but it wouldn't budge, she jumped out of the raft tried to push it from behind, but it wouldn't budge, finally she started calling for help from the other people rafting down the river. We were eventually bailed out by some people who kayaked over and started pulling us out of the raft. I left that day thinking about how amazing it was to see the nice calm river, begin to overflow the walls of our raft, and what started out as a trickle soon became a flood, and within minutes that raft was completely submerged in the water.

I think the same thing happens to this woman at the well, she tried to bail herself out, but the harder she tried to bail, the more her spirit was filled with living water. She tried to tell Jesus that she was a Samaritan, but he didn't buy that excuse, she tried to tell Jesus that she is an unmarried woman, but he doesn't buy that excuse either, and finally she is out of excuses. Her life has been flooded by grace in a big way. The living water that she was once searching for is now bursting out of her. The living water that she received from Jesus Christ has shaken her up, for where she was once thirsty her spirit has been quenched.

Hear the good news the same living water that burst forth in Samaria 2000 years ago, bursts forth today, and I don't know about y'all but I think it is time we start to drink from that well.




JULY NURSERY WORKERS
