Baskets or containers must be supplied by the exhibitor and will be given every possible care, but the management assumes no responsibility for their safety.

Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.

The management may at any time order the removal or any exhibit which is in bad condition.

Any article manifestly unfit to show may be excluded.

All entries must be grown by exhibitor except in arrangement classes.

The judge's decision is final.

All Exhibits must be at the Fairgrounds on Monday by noon.

Collections cannot compete for single premiums.

Exhibitors are requested to label variety names on all plants and flowers.

No articles accepted over 15" and/or over 20 pounds in weight.

Item being entered must have been completed in the last year.

No article can compete as more than one entry; that is, an article can be judged but once.

All clothing must be clean and pressed.

Each exhibit to be judged on workmanship, worth of article, appropriateness of material and design.

Must be made by the person entering.

Basis for judging household and needlework exhibits:

Plain sewing -- Lingerie or aprons to be judged on:

1. Worth of article
2. Materials and trimmings, appropriateness, quality
3. Workmanship - method of construction, choice and execution of stitches

Dressmaking:

1. Material- appropriateness, quality, color, design
2. Design - simplicity of line, harmony of color, appropriateness
3. Workmanship - method of construction, choice and execution of stitches

Embroidery, Knitting and Crocheting - simple designs and edges for trimming to be judged in:

1. Worth of article
2. Material - appropriateness and suitability for use for which it was made
3. Design - simplicity and appropriateness
4. Workmanship

All garments must have a tag with material description attached.

All articles must be picked up Saturday after 9:00 p.m.



Section 1 - Clothing

Each garment to be judged on material, color, design, suitability and workmanship.

All articles of clothing must have been made since the close of last year's fair by the exhibitor. Any repeats will be disqualified.
