- 2. Design simplicity of line, harmony of color, appropriateness
- 3. Workmanship method of construction, choice and execution of stitches

Embroidery, Knitting and Crocheting - simple designs and edges for trimming to be judged in:

- 1. Worth of article
- 2. Material appropriateness and suitability for use for which it was made
- 3. Design simplicity and appropriateness
- 4. Workmanship

All garments must have a tag with material description attached. All articles must be picked up Saturday after 9:00 p.m.
