Member Perspective: What It Means to Be an ECYC Member



The reasons why people join ECYC are as diverse as the people who belong to ECYC. Many have joined the yacht club for the love of the water and the obvious interest in boating (whether they own a vessel or not); others joined because they are new to the area and wanted to become part of the community; others who might not be new to the area have joined to meet new people and explore new things; some have joined simply because their friends are members; and yet others have joined because the Club offers a guiet place of respite and relaxation with an unparalleled view

of the river. For whatever diverse reasons people join the Club there is one common element-people join the Club because they think it can add value to their lives, either personally or professionally...and common wisdom says that people will continue to be a part of a club until they no longer perceive the value.

By its definition the concept of a club involves communal activity. There is a role and a place at ECYC for everyone no matter who you are, what you do, what your talents are or what time

constraints you have. Board members and those who run and coordinate the various activities and events welcome participation from everyone. While they might not reach out to you, please do not let that preclude you from reaching out to them. ECYC wants no one to reach beyond their capabilities or time constraints but ECYC wants you to truly feel like you are a member of the really special community that is FCYC.



I know for a fact that the feeling comes with and through participation in and the planning of Club activities and events. I can assure you that there is no better feeling than to run or assist with an event and have attendees smiling, happy and enjoying

themselves. True, there will always be those who are negative or critical but ECYC's history has proven that the best antidote is to invite such members to participate in planning the next event, and advising how to avoid that which caused them displeasure. It is special to witness first- hand the real camaraderie found at ECYC. Sure it sounds trite, but through participation you make new friends, you develop new talents and interests and you get to spend time with awesome people. (There is a group of us right now planning a special get together to varnish furniture - add wine and hors d'oeuvres and it's a party- the intent is for many hands to make light work of a rather mundane task. We are not special committee members, we don't know each other well, but as we were participating in the winter cleanup we all noticed that something needs to be done, and decided that we are going to do it together. After all ECYC is our club.) ECYC is your club too.

I know that ECYC provides more value to you when you make yourself a part of it. For my first few years at the Club I sat on the sidelines. I stuck with the people I knew. I took what the Club could offer, but I did not offer anything to the Club. I knew little about Club events and I knew less about its members, until the day I volunteered to help with the Fourth of July party. My great contribution for the day...I washed dishes. The day was sweltering and by its end my hands were chapped, but I met more people and had more fun that day than my two prior years of membership. Sure I had more to offer the Club than my dishwashing talents (I am a practicing lawyer) but until I put myself in the mix, ECYC had no idea what I was willing to do or capable of, and I had no real idea of the value of ECYC. I was resolute that I did not have the time...but ECYC let me participate at my own pace, and I came to realize that the more involved I got, the more value the Club had for me. Personally, I then went on to chair a number of events, using lessons learned even from that day I washed dishes to improve them. Not too long after, I became the Entertainment Chairman and later the Membership Chairman. Without a doubt as I increased my participation, the Club and its members meant more to me. Clearly in my life its value increased: I felt part of it and responsible for it. I became part of the team that provides the value that everyone seeks from the Club, and I wanted to share that with others and invited them to join, and they did. Clearly my enthusiasm for ECYC, and the Club's value to me was unknowingly tied to my participation. (If you do any research on Club membership, this is the norm.)

Last year I voluntarily stepped off the Board. I wanted to make room for people with new ideas, and give others the opportunity to glean from membership what I had. In addition, my workload had increased and it deserved my undivided attention. This resulted in my sitting back on the sidelines again, as I had so many years before, and guess what happened... I did not go to the Club or participate in Club events as I had in the past. I distanced myself from the activities, even weekly dinners, and upon reflection realized that for me my membership in ECYC wasn't the
