

Begin forwarded message: From: Thomas MRAZ <<u>trazz66@comcast.net</u>> Subject: Video and volunteer schedule of Woodland Cemetery Lonny,

"The enclosed video showcases some of the work many of us volunteers have done during the last 4years at Woodland Cemetery in Henrico County. I previously was volunteering at the VA hospital for about 4 years as a van driver for the DAV, picking up veterans and taking them to their doctor's appointments, until the covid hit hard. The VA turned away all the volunteers and never brought back the drivers but has since started requesting volunteers for within the hospital. The VA did away with the DAV driver program all together but still has the 5 cars and vans just sitting in the parking lot, doing nothing!!!

My wife and I stumbled upon Woodland Cemetery one day and were somewhat afraid to enter because the grass and weeds were taller than most of the tombstones, but we did see that Arthur Ashe's plot was cleared, so we ventured in. I returned about 3 months later and noticed that someone had started cutting some of the grass. On my way out I stopped when I noticed a gentleman near the gate. I introduced myself and he told me his name was Marvin Harris and that he was the head of a nonprofit group that purchased the cemetery. The group wanted to clean up and restore the grounds. I mentioned I would be willing to help sometime if needed, 3 days later he called me. That was going on for 5 years now! I'm usually there up to 3 days a week, cutting overgrown bush, cutting grass, locating buried tombstone or just being a team leader for our weekly volunteer groups. We have cleared 19 and 1/2 acres enough to cut the grass weekly. The grass cutting alone takes me 26 hours when no one can help me. We hopefully have some

gentlemen agree to help this coming season. We have another 10 wooded acres and we estimate that there are about 5 thousand graves that need to be identified. We have been blessed to have many volunteer groups come out to help in the clearing of this area, but we have a long way to go. I'm also enclosing a recent schedule of some of the groups that will be coming out to help. You will notice that the Army sends 40 soldiers to help quite often. We have deceased veterans of all branches buried here that served our country all the way back to the Spanish-American War. It's my honor to show them respect by keeping their resting place clear."...Tom Mraz He closed with these final words:

"The hundreds of volunteers that showed respect for the thousands of lost souls, buried at Woodland Cemetery, by helping with this restoration project is the real story." Thanks...Tom Mraz

HOUSTON-HOLICKY-SITTER VETERANS FORUM MC: Col. Bill Parrish, USMC Ret.

HHS Veterans' Forum meets next on Tuesday April 8, 2025.

Location will be Publix, 2250 John Rolfe Pky, Henrico, VA 23233. We will be in the Community Meeting Room on the 2nd floor.

The guest speaker will be Eric Carlson, LtCol, USMC (Ret) and his topic will be Volume 3 of the life of General Al Gray.

Doors open at 1115, the program begins at 1150, and the program will conclude by 1300. Lunch may be purchased from the Publix' Deli.

The Houston-Holicky-Sitter Veterans' Forum is an informal forum for veterans of all branches of the armed forces. Col. Joseph J. Holicky, Jr. (USMC, ret.) and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Col. Carl L. Sitter (USMC, ret.) began having lunch together in the mid 1970's following their retirements. Over the years other veterans and local active duty Marines joined them for lunch. In the early 1980's Lt. Col. L.W. "Chip" Houston (USMCR, ret.) became part of the leadership team and served as its Master of Ceremonies for over 25 years. Today nearly 100 veterans meet each month to carry on the HHS tradition and to hear prominent guest speakers address military history, national security issues, and other topics of interest to veterans.

HHS is apolitical, and promotion of political interests is prohibited. HHS is a not-for-profit group, but it is neither a 501c3 nor a 501c4 organization.

LtCol Eric Carlson USMC, Ret



Lt. Col. Eric Carlson, USMC (retired) Lt. Col. Carlson describes himself as a "run-of-themill" U.S. Marine Corps infantry officer who retired in 2003 as Director of Operations (G-3) for Marine Corps University. He was Chief of Plans for 2nd Marine Division in the liberation of Kosovo and has a Master's degree in military studies from the Marine Corps University. His other assignments include: Weapons Company Commander with BLT 3/1 in the liberation of Kuwait, Rifle Company Commander (Lima 3/1) with Joint Task Force 6, Infantry Officer Course Instructor and Basic School Tactics Instructor, S-3A for BLT 2/6 and BLT 1/8 in Beirut, and Weapons and Rifle Platoon Commander with Fox 2/6 in Beirut. In retirement, Lt. Col Carlson helped gather the official oral history of General Alfred M. Gray, Jr. through 17 recorded interview sessions with Al Gray, Scott Laidig, Paul Otte, and J.D. Baker, which also supported the publication of the Al Gray, Marine series of biographies.


Marine Corps Reading
