### *The Connection Between Source Water Protection and Climate Change Mitigation*

Adam Carpenter is the Manager of Energy and Environmental Policy at AWWA's Water Policy and Leadership department in Washington, DC. He serves as an expert and advocate on a diverse set of drinking water issues including source water protection, the energy-water nexus, cyanotoxins, climate change, consumer confidence reports, and other environmental policy concerns. He holds a Ph.D. in environmental science and public policy from George Mason University.

### *5 Million More Trees for Maryland: Forests for a Changing Climate*

Anne Hairston-Strang is Acting State Forester for the Maryland Department of Natural Resources Forest Service. Anne hails from Easton, MD and has worked for MD Forest Service since 1997 on watershed forestry and sustainability. She has a Ph.D. in forest hydrology from Oregon State University, M.S. in forest soils from the University of Minnesota, and a B.S. in forest management from Virginia Tech.



### *Funding Mechanisms for Source Water Protection*

Seth Robertson is Hazen and Sawyer's corporate infrastructure funding leader. He has extensive experience in water infrastructure funding, financial analysis and modeling, asset management, and capital improvement planning. He is experienced in assisting communities and utilities in determining and prioritizing capital needs and developing feasible long-term implementation plans. He previously served as SRF Section Chief for the State of North Carolina and was co-Chair of the national EPA and State SRF workgroups.
