Holiday Beef Stew



Beef Stew is the perfect meal for a few or many on Thanksgiving, Christmas or through the holidays. It's healthy, economical, easy-peasy, and often associated with good family memories. My Dad used to make a french variation of this called Beef Ragout, to which he substituted merlot wine for 1 cup of water!

Here's a basic recipe. I add bay leaf to mine, instead of parsley!

Prepare in crock pot or stock pot. 10 Servings. Enjoy!

2 pounds cubed beef stew meat

	F
	3 tablespoons vegetable oil
	4 cubes beef bouillon, crumbled
	4 cups water
	1 teaspoon dried rosemary
	1 teaspoon dried parsley
	½ teaspoon ground black pepper
	3 large potatoes, peeled and cubed
	4 medium (blank)s carrots, cut into 1-inch
pieces	
	4 stalks celery, cut into 1-inch pieces
	1 large onion, chopped
	2 teaspoons cornstarch
	2 teaspoons cold water

In a large pot or dutch oven, cook beef in oil over medium heat until brown.

Dissolve bouillon in water and pour into pot. Stir in rosemary, parsley and pepper.

Bring to a boil, then reduce heat, cover and simmer 1 hour.

Stir potatoes, carrots, celery, and onion into the pot. Dissolve cornstarch in 2 teaspoons cold water and stir into stew.

Cover and simmer 1 hour more.






