BE STORMWATER SMART DURING THE SUMMER SEASON



- Plant a raingarden Rain gardens are native plants set in a hole or trench in the ground to help rain water infiltrate into the ground.
- Set up a rain barrel You can capture rainwater off your roof with a rain barrel, and then use the water in your garden or let it infiltrate slowly into the ground.
- ♦ Lawn Care Don't overwater your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible. Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drain.
- Keep basins clean Wash vehicles on surfaces that the dirty water and chemicals do not end up in basins. Also, do not dump anything into basins (household chemicals, feces, trash, food, etc.).
