PROJECT LIFESAVER

What is Project Lifesaver?

Project Lifesaver is a rapid response program designed to track and locate lost individuals. This program is designed specifically for families living with Alzheimer's Disease, Autism, Down Syndrome, Dementia, and other related disorders.



How does the program work?

Individuals enrolled in the program are fitted with a personalized radio transmitter bracelet. When a member wanders away, the caregiver notifies the Sheriff's Office. Specially trained officers respond to the wanderer's area and use mobile tracking receivers to locate the transmitters signal. This proven technology has enabled quick recovery times averaging less than 30 minutes. Families are quickly notified and reunited!



Benefits

With the ability of the Project Lifesaver tracking device, a search can be successfully concluded in less than an hour, at minimum cost to the community. More importantly than the financial savings that Project Lifesaver brings to the community, it offers the law enforcement agency the ability to quickly and safely bring a wandering person home. Families and caregivers live with an enormous amount of stress when their loved one suffers from dementia, and the ability to quickly find them should they accidentally wander from home brings a comfort that no other method can provide.
