



Why Secure Links inHere?

As an added layer of security for our customers, accessing any link embedded in a document sent to you outside of inHere now requires you to log in to the inHere Portal to authenticate.

How do I access Secure Links inHere?

To access secure links, you will need:

- ✓ An inHere account / login credentials (username & password)
- ✓ Permissions from your Title & Escrow Company to view the document(s)

Scenario #1

- ✓ You have inHere login credentials.
- ✓ You have been provided permissions.

After clicking a secure link, you will be prompted to log in to inHere. Then, you will be taken directly to the document(s).

Scenario #2

- ✓ You have inHere login credentials.
- ✗ You have NOT been provided permissions.

1. **After clicking a secure link, you will be prompted to log in to inHere.**
2. **Click *REQUEST ACCESS*.**
3. **Enter the reason you need access.**
4. **Click *REQUEST ACCESS*.**
5. **Once your request has been processed, you will receive an email with a link to the document.**

Scenario #3

- ✗ You do NOT have inHere login credentials.
- ✗ You have NOT been provided permissions.

1. **After clicking a secure link, you will be prompted to log in to inHere.**
2. **Since you do not have an inHere account, click *Not registered for inHere?***
3. **Enter your first name, last name, email address, the reason you need access, a password. and your chosen password again to confirm.**
4. **Click *REGISTER*.**
5. **Once your request has been processed, you will receive an email with a link to the document.**
