GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:

- 1. All exhibitors agree to accept these regulations and any regulations pertaining to a department when entering. Please call (928) 899-6056 if you have any questions.
- 2. All exhibits must conform with special regulations of the proper department. Agriculture, Horticulture, and Floriculture must be grown by the exhibitor. Any entry (except livestock) that has been previously shown at the Yavapai Fair shall be disqualified. A "professional" is anyone who sells said item from his home or business and makes 50% or more of his income from said activity. "Junior" or "Youth" is a person 19 years or younger as of the first day of the fair, unless otherwise specified within the department.
- 3. Online Entry is available at (www.yavapaifair.com), In Addition to Online Entry we can accept entry forms via the mail (Yavapai Fair, P.O. Box 1271, Chino Valley, AZ 86323).
- 4. Check department regulations for deadlines and specific entry forms.
- 5. Every entry shall be entered in the name of the owner and/or the person who created the item. ALL ENTRANTS MUST BE ARIZONA RESIDENTS. You also must have planted and grown in Yavapai County for Floriculture/ Horticulture.
- 6. All judges will be selected by the Fair and the awards of the judges will be accepted by entrants. JUDGES will make no award where, in their opinion, the exhibit is not worthy, regardless of number of exhibits in the Division or Class. No exhibitor shall interfere in any way, either by making suggestions or arguing with a judge. In any violation of this rule, the exhibitor will be barred from exhibition and will forfeit premiums and entry fees. In the event if a dispute, the decision of the Fair Committee will be final.
- 7. All exhibitors will be expected to remove their exhibits or make arrangements for removal with the superintendent of the proper department on Sunday, September 8, 2019 **AFTER 6:00 P.M.**
- 8. THE FAIR WILL TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION TO GIVE PROPER CARE AND PROTECTION OF EXHIBITS BUT WILL NOT ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ANY EXHIBIT OR PERSON. Any property left over two (2) days after closing of Fair (September 8, 2019) becomes the property of the Yavapai Fair and may be disposed of.
- Premiums will be paid by the Yavapai Fair. All checks will be available at the Department by Sunday September 8, 2019 after 6:00pm. ***NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED****. Unclaimed monies & Checks not cashed within 90 days of September 8, 2019 will be reinvested into next year's fair.

We will furnish containers for all cut flowers and herbs. Cut flowers will be watered by the department and removed when they are unsuited to remain. House plants will be watered (unless labeled). ALL FLOWER ENTRIES SHOULD HAVE FOLIAGE.

Use general entry form. You may enter on line or bring the completed form with your entry. All entries will be received on Wednesday, September 4, 2019 from 2:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Entries will be on display and will not be released until Sunday, September 8, 2019 after 6:00 pm until 8:00 pm. Neither Superintendents nor the Fair are liable for loss or damage to exhibits left after this time. Any entries left become the property of the Fair and may be discarded. Judging is done by certified Master Gardeners; all decisions are final. Judging is closed to the public. Awards will be given in the following classes: Garden Flowers, Roses, Herbs, Junior, Best of Show.

Exhibits must have been grown in Yavapai County by a Yavapai County resident.

Each person may make as many entries as desired, but only one entry in each class.

If any questions call one of the superintendents. HANGINGS must have tabs or a two-inch sleeve for displaying them (sleeve preferred). Entries must have been completed during the Fair year. ITEMS WHICH ARE SOILED, STAINED, PET HAIRS, OR UNSANITARY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. . Length and width measurements will be needed.

The Department Superintendent reserves the right to reclassify and or the right to interpret rules and regulations to amend or add to these rules. **RIBBON AWARDS ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

If the organization does not have an official dress then a long sleeve button down western style shirt, pants or skirt, and closed toe shoes. NOTE: The youth livestock committee may dismiss or restrict an exhibitor from the class or sale for inappropriate attire including, but not limited to, any wording promoting drugs, alcohol, & profanity. Check with your superintendent in advance if you have any questions regarding your attire.

- Photo's Photos need to have a visible picture of the animal markings as well as the exhibitor face.
- Late Entries will be accepted, with the understanding that late entries will sell at the end of the auction except for Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Animals.

General Rules & Information

- The Yavapai Fair assumes no responsibility for loss or damage. All animals must be free of infectious diseases and its signs. Show management has the right to ask for any animal showing signs of ill health or behavioral problems to leave the premises.
- All exhibits not claimed by 7:00pm on Sunday will be disposed of by the Yavapai County Youth Livestock Committee and Yavapai County Fair.
- Exhibitor will be responsible for feeding and watering his/her animals, cleaning their stalls, and keeping their portion of the aisles clean at all times during the fair for the safely of all exhibitors and general public.
- 4. Animals should be fit, cared, and handled by the exhibitor. Parents or Leaders can assist, NOT DO! The Fair Committee will ask parents doing too much to stop if they are doing, if they do not stop, the exhibitor can be disqualified.
- All exhibits are to be owned by the exhibitor or under a lease agreement.
- 6. The showmanship animal must be the animal entered in market unless no market animal is entered.
- Exhibitor must show animal both in conformation and showmanship to be eligible to sell.
- Exhibitors must provide their own bedding, as well as feed and water containers.
- 9. Animals will be placed according to the weight of the official scale.
- All animals will be checked by the official show vet, if there are health concerns it will be address by the show vet and can result in disqualification.



- 11. The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all animals.
- 12. Animals do not need to be pure bred to enter the Yavapai County

Judging:

- All Conformation judging of animals will be done in the manner of the Danish Award System. The decision is the decision of the judge and all judge's decisions are final. If there is a case of fraud or misrepresentation the award will be removed, and the exhibitor will be disqualified.
- Showmanship is a judging of the exhibitor's ability to show, fit, and handle the project. Questions can be answered as part of the judging process.

Auction Rules

- All ribbon awards blue, red, and white will sell in the livestock auction.
- No private treaty sales will be allowed on the fair premises, the fair has a consignment sale process for all exhibitors to sell animals and projects outside the livestock auction.

- An exhibitor may sell one large livestock, one small stock and/or one indoor exhibit in the live auction.
- The sale order will be Grand Champions, Reserve Champions, then all blue, red, white ribbons, then late entries.
- An exhibitor must notify the sale secretary in writing by 4:00pm Friday Night prior to the Auction if they are pulling from the auction. No Grand or Reserve Champion animal will be allowed to pull from the auction, All Grand & Reserve Champion Animals are required to sell.
- The Yavapai County Fair, Yavapai Fair Foundation, Inc. does not guarantee the sale of any animal or project. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to promote the auction to prospective buyers.
- NO costumes or decorations in any way will be allowed in the sale
- Official Dress must be worn by all exhibitors in the auction ring.
- 7% commission will be deducted from the total proceeds, including add-ons, of each item sold in the auction.



 All entries must include a plain, white 4" x 6" card(s), typed or neatly written in ink, (NO PENCIL). Card must include entry tag number, age, years in project and information specific to project.
