



### **Pesach**

One of our most beautiful holidays is Passover, which is our oldest holiday. It marks the anniversary of the birth of Israel as a people.

The Story It begins with the story of Joseph, the son of Jacob. Joseph was sold into slavery by his jealous brothers. He was finally brought to Egypt. Because of his wisdom and foresight, he became a great man; second in command only to Pharoah. When Joseph achieved his high position he brought his father Jacob, and his brothers, and entire family of 70 people to Goshen, Egypt. They all lived together for over 400 years of peace.

Time passed and eventually Jacob and his 12 sons died. His family grew larger as the years went by. A new Pharoah arose on the throne of Egypt. This man did not wish to remember the important contributions that Joseph had made to the welfare and development of Egypt. This wicked man imposed heavy taxes upon the Israelites and subjugated them. Because of their increasing number, Pharoah was afraid that they may someday take over his kingdom. Eventually the Israelites were forced into slave labor. Never forget that these Jews built the great fortresses of Rameses and Pithom. However, despite the harsh treatment the Israelites received, they multiplied rapidly and became stronger. As a result, Pharoah issued an edict to kill all the newborn sons of the Israelites. This he thought would be the answer to the Jewish problem.

The plight of the Israelites grew steadily worse and finally G-d in his kindness sent them the great prophet, Moses the son of Abraham. With his brother, Aaron Moses appeared before Pharoah and asked him in the name of G-d to free the Israelites and allow them to go out into the wilderness to worship their G-d. Pharoah refused. Moses then performed a miracle. He threw down his rod and it became a snake. He wanted to convince the Pharoah that he came in the name of G-d. The king was not impressed and he refused to let the Israelites go. G-d then began to punish the Egyptians with severe plagues. It was not until the 10th plague, the slaughter of the first born males of every Egyptian family, that Pharoah's will was broken: for he himself was broken for he himself was a first born. In the middle of the night, Pharoah, whose own son lay dead before him. He called for Moses and Aaron and begged them to take the Israelites out of Egypt. Moses gathered the Israelites together and left Egypt in great haste.

<u>Laws of Passover</u> Passover is celebrated from the 15th through 22nd day of the Hebrew month of "Nissan". The first two and the last two days are called "Yom Tov", the middle 4 days are called "Chol Hamoed". It is customary to begin to study the laws of Passover 30 days before the holiday in order to become familiar with all the regulations of the holiday.
