WEEKLY THOUGHTS -THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST  
JUNE 22<sup>nd</sup> 2025

Dear friends, welcome to the celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ left to us as a memorial and enduring presence in the Eucharist. Jesus instituted the Eucharist on the night before he endured his suffering and death. This event was very important at the Apostolic preaching; “that the Lord Jesus on the night he was betrayed, he took bread and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, *“This is my Body that is for you, do this in memory of me.”* In the same way he also took the cup, after supper saying, *“This cup is the new covenant of my Blood, do this as often as you drink it in memory of me.”*

These words of Eucharistic consecration when prayed over the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ for our salvation and food as we journey to eternity. Indeed, the Spirit transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus to give us life and salvation.

The Gospel of Luke 9: 11-17 is about the multiplication of 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish reserved as packed lunch for the Apostles which Jesus used to feed over 5,000 people. This miracle prefigures Jesus becoming food or bread for the people journeying to eternity. Jesus as the bread of life, gave up his life on Good Friday for the salvation of humankind.

In the presence of a challenge, Jesus asked his disciples to respond to the need of the time; *“Give them some food yourselves.”* The disciples provided to Jesus the 5 loaves and 2 fish that Jesus multiplied to feed the hungry crowds and all went away satisfied. Jesus turned the little contribution into a massive meal for the people to eat and have life. We should always take the initiative to help. One writer puts it, *“never ignore a small sign of generosity”*.

Let us find time to be before the Jesus in the Eucharist for growth in intimate relationship with Jesus. Let us begin to ask the Spirit of Jesus to guide us in prayer as we pray before Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Let us go to Jesus as we are to cure our spiritual ills and restore us to true peace of heart and mind.

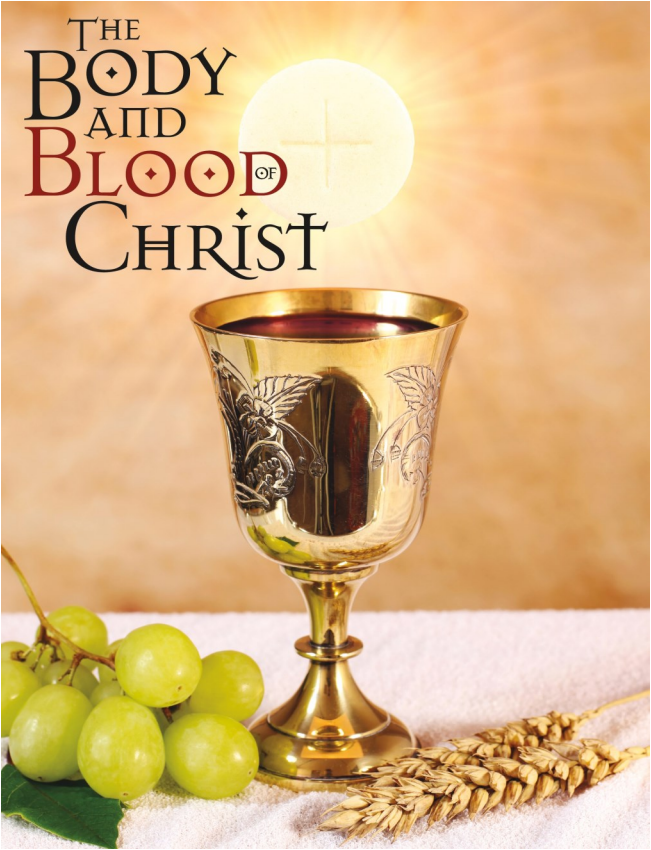
