Dear NHBC Family

So much to share with you at this busy time of year.

First, I want to say thank you to Alexandria Lumpkin for her time as the children's ministry intern. I love the Christmas season, but it can get hectic and I admit that I have gotten caught up in the stress of it before. I continue to remind myself that this is not a time that is supposed to be focused on the traditions of the holiday – lights, trees, presents and a jolly man in a red suit. Instead, our hearts and minds should be focused on the fact that Jesus was sent by God to earth in the form of an innocent baby. Because of that gift, we have eternal hope.

May all of us lay down the stress that comes with this annual celebration and set our hearts to remembering the reason we are celebrating – Jesus, our Savior, is born!

Prayer Thoughts

LAUNCHING PRAYER AND BIBLE STUDY AS A VITAL PART OF YOUR LIFE DURING CHRISTMAS 2019 AND THROUGHOUT THE YEAR 2020

(A collage from Jesus Calling, Experiencing God Day by Day & His Prayers & Mine)

Jesus prays for people who really believe in Him:
"I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word." John 17:20

Prayer was a vital part of Jesus' life. Jesus is our Savior and needs to be Lord of our lives.

CHALLENGE: As you embrace this 2019 Christmas season begin a daily commitment to personal Prayer, Bible reading (be in—stay into reading the Word of God—encouragement: read the entire Bible in 2020 using a selected plan), and to a dedicated endeavor toward pursuing your personal spiritual transformation growth. Also, for 2020 continue this daily commitment of communication with God seeking to understand and know His perspective for your life in serving Him well.

Consider one event when Jesus prayed as recorded in Luke 3:21:
When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened. . . .

The greatest moments in a Christian's life come through prayer.

- When Jesus prayed, heaven opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him. The Spirit came upon the disciples as they gathered to pray on the day of Pentecost (Acts 1:14; 2:1).
- When the disciples prayed together after Pentecost, their gathering place was shaken, and they were emboldened to proclaim the gospel throughout the city (Acts 4:31).

Prayer is not a substitute for hard work—prayer is the work!

- God does things in and through our lives by prayer that He does in no other way.
- As we pray and as our attention is turned toward God, we become more receptive to aligning our lives with His will.
- God will not equip us with His power while we are racing off to our next appointment! His Spirit will not empower us if we are oblivious to what He is saying.
- God requires our complete attention before He will fill us with the powerful presence of His Spirit.

If you want to learn how to pray, use Jesus as your model.

- Jesus did not always receive what He asked for, but His prayers were always heard and always answered (Mark 14:36; Heb. 5:7).
- If you do not sense the Holy Spirit's power in your life, you may not be spending adequate time in prayer.
- Perhaps you are pursuing your own agenda rather than seeking the Father's will.
- You may have abandoned the place of prayer before God's answer came.

If you will commit yourself to spend sustained time in prayer, asking for God's kingdom on earth, God will work in your life just as He did in the lives of Jesus and His disciples.

Once you've accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior, Jesus becomes a part of your life intimately via your heart, mind, and spirit.

- Remember Jesus is God the Son and knows everything about you.
- You don't need to work at revealing yourself to Jesus.
- Find Jesus through prayer and listen for Him to communicate with you.
- Many people spend a lifetime or a small fortune searching for someone who understands them.
- Jesus is freely available to people who open their hearts, call upon

- His Name, and who receive Him as Savior.
- This simple act of faith is the beginning of a lifelong love story.
- Jesus the Lover of your soul, understands you perfectly, and loves you eternally.

The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth. —Psalm 145:18 nkjv.

"Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." —Luke 12:7
Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. —John 1:12
Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. —Romans 10:13

When Jesus expressed His prayer of John 17:20 (noted above), He is praying as the head of His body, the Church. While He prayed this prayer, He expressed the concerns and benefits of all of His members (then and now) which were on His mind. Remember Jesus was getting ready to lay down His life for all mankind. If today's Church would only see Jesus as we see Him praying here, we would have the much-needed confidence and encouragement we lack.

Today, we think of this prayer of Jesus with consideration for your unconverted friends 3 know Him. And this was not a "lumping together" of the unconverted; because only He could accomplish this kind of intercession, Jesus had every single possible individual person fitting this description in mind! **First**, He prays for the people you know and care about in the condition of their unbelief – that they may believe; **and then** He prays for them when they do believe, as a result of the Holy Spirit's convicting work.

As you encounter God during your daily, planned time with Him intercede for your lost friends, even at this moment, the devil is using whatever devices he can to keep them from coming to a knowledge of the truth and from trusting Jesus for their salvation.

2019 Contributions

Contributions to the 2019 operating budget may be made until Tuesday, December 31st by turning them in to the office by 3 pm. If mailed, they must be post-marked by the same day, the 31st, to be included in 2019 contributions. Also, as a reminder, appreciated stock can be given to NHBC to receive great tax benefits. You receive a deduction for the value of the stock, but do not pay income taxes on the stock appreciation! Forced to take distributions from your 401k or IRA due to age? To avoid paying tax on (some or all of) the distribution, you can ask them to send it directly to the church as a contribution. Check with your financial advisor or call your investment company.

Reminder: do not file your income tax return before you receive your charitable giving statement from NHBC. If you file before receipt and had individual contributions of \$250 or more, you may not be able to deduct them.
