

Days for Girls (DFG) received some great photos of a kit distribution to women in Ansavo, Haiti, by our mission partner H.A.R.T. (Haiti and Africa Relief Team).

The doctors did a three-part program to cover all of the information. A young woman who traveled with H.A.R.T. worked with three young women from the community, and sometimes the girls' mothers, to ensure that the girls all felt competent to handle the kits. In the words of Dr. Joyce, "It was awesome!"

But the smiles on the girls' faces will remind you of other girls you've seen at distributions. Thanks to you and all you do, we were able to fill this order and bring this gift to all those girls.


