**Rock Island County Health Department reports 1 new death, 25 new cases of COVID-19**

The Rock Island County Health Department reports the COVID-19 death of a man in his 90s, bringing the total number of COVID-19 deaths to 31.

We are saddened to report that another member of our community has died from this virus. We extend our deepest sympathies to his family at this difficult time.

In addition, the department reports 25 new COVID-19 cases, bringing the total number to 1,575. Currently, 12 patients are hospitalized. The number of deaths stands at 31.
