Access to physical (off-web) sources

Study the local history of an area to gain critical context.

It is often useful to call a Town or County Clerk to inquire about access to Birth, Marriage, Death (BMD) records. In many instances they may however create a derivative document. Request the originals when possible, or ask where the originals are kept. It often helps to call or speak to people, gaining their interest.

Contact or visit local libraries and relevant genealogical and historical societies. They are often pleased to help, involving their local expertise.

- Rooted in the extensive work of the LDS church
- Large Indexing effort accomplished : MA
- Large collection of <u>non-indexed</u> records: <u>MA</u>
- Barnstable County Deeds
- Build your family tree connected to a "WorldTree"
 - Find famous relatives and Where am I From?
 - or standalone under FamilySearch Genealogies.
- Comprehensive genealogy/records Wiki
- FamilySearch Mobile app available.
- Locked records available at <u>Family Search Affiliate</u> <u>Libraries</u> – such as <u>Falmouth Public Library</u>.

Ancestry.com – primary subscription site

- Birthed by BYU students marketing LDS records.
- Apparently the largest record set.
- Three membership levels:
 - U.S. Discovery \$229/year
 - World Explorer \$319/year
 - All Access \$389/year adds Fold3, Newspapers.com
- Largest DNA database connected tree matches
- All family trees are separate & not mergeable.
- Ancestry.com <u>Mobile app</u> available
- Recovering records involving mangled indexing
 - Jared Lamphere in 1880 Census:
 - Wildcards | Soundex | Correcting a Record
- Ancestry Library Edition, American Ancestors and more:
 - available via <u>Falmouth Public Library website</u>

Examining and assessing a record

- "Evidence Explained" by Eliz. Shown Mills
- A key publication on citations, reasonably exhaustive search, resolving conflicts, the Genealogical Proof Standard (GPS)
- Distinguish a "Source" from "Information"
- Source: What you can hold in your hand (a book, photo)
- Information: Content from the source:
 - A date, name, place, cause of death...
 - Usually provided by an informant who had knowledge of the info.

Three types of Sources – a hierarchy

- Original: original document of an event
 - Better if created at or near the time of the event
- Derivative: Compiled from original or other records
 - Transcripts, indexes, abstracts
- Authored Works: new creations compiled from sources
 - Family histories, Pedigree tree, journal articles

Three types of Information – a hierarchy

- Primary (first-hand): First-hand knowledge by an eyewitness.
- Secondary: Second-hand knowledge or hearsay.
- Unknown: not certain whether primary or secondary

Three types of Evidence

- Direct Evidence: Information that explicitly answers the research question without needing another source or tool to determine the answer.
- Indirect Evidence: Incomplete information, implied and needing other documents, knowledge or tools to find the answer.
- Negative Evidence: Evidence showing that an alleged fact did not occur. This is different than negative search results.
