



Global Medical Libraries (GML) shipments, even those with a US street address, require a **US Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note - CP 72 PS Form 2976-A (July 2013) PSN 7530-01-000-9834**, which are available at local USPS branches.

Step-by-step instructions to complete the **US Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note-CP 72 PS Form 2976-A (July 2013) PSN 7530-01-000-9834** are on the GML website. Simply click "*Shipping and US Customs Form Instructions.*" The donor absorbs the shipping costs. The most economical way to mail the books is via USPS Media Mail rate, which is approximately \$1/lb. Please limit boxes to 12 lbs. each and send no more than 4 boxes to one address at the same time.

All medical academic institutions need medical education resources covering all aspects of health and wellness, including mental health, nutrition, pre-hospital, physical/occupational therapy and pre-hospital. All resources should have current information. No paper journals.

The Mission of the Eye Institute is to train ophthalmologists and staff in Cameroon and French-Speaking Central West Africa to become the next generation of leaders and to provide high quality eye care services with subspecialties (currently unavailable in Central Africa) and outreach programs, minimizing the need to send patients abroad. All 4 Ethiopian institutions are requesting health sciences educational materials, including behavioral health, public health and tropical medicine, to produce competent and ethical health professionals through practice oriented, problem solving and quality education.

Ambo University, established in 1939, is one of the fastest growing Ethiopian universities. It envisions becoming a renowned University choice in eastern Africa. The Medicine and Health Sciences College is one of its 5 colleges. The university is requesting formal and continuing educational materials for the Ambo University Library, which strives to support the needs of all users, from the professor engaged in advanced research to the first-year student.

Arsi University, established in 2014, is one of Ethiopia's youngest public universities. It is located in the town of Asela, in the Oromia region. It has five colleges: College of Agriculture & Environmental Science; College of Business & Economics; College of Health Sciences; College of Education & Behavioral Sciences; College of Social Sciences & Humanities and School of Law. The College of Health Sciences offers undergraduate and graduate programs to educate and train a health work force to serve in communities throughout Ethiopia.

Defense College Health Sciences in Debre Zeit, Ethiopia has dental, medical and nursing programs. 600 students per year graduate with the US version of a baccalaureate degree. Requests the following textbooks: Internal Medicine, Nutrition, Mental Health, Critical Care, Surgical, Psychiatry, Ophthalmology and Optometry; dentistry and nursing.

Wollega University, also known as Nekemte University, is a public university in Nekemte, a town in the Western Oromia Region of Ethiopia. It was founded in 2007 and currently runs 82 undergraduate, 45 postgraduate and 5 Ph. D programs under 7 Colleges, 3 Schools and 1 Institute.

Purpose: A request for Medical Education Resources will support health education capacity building of the Tanzania Peoples Defense Forces (TPDF) to optimize the learning environment for military medical officers.

Background: The TPDF Military College of Medical Sciences began training paramedical courses in 1972 by training medics and nursing assistants. The college currently offers a curriculum that includes a Diploma in Nursing, Diploma in Clinical Medicine, Advanced Diploma in Clinical Medicine, and Junior and Senior Medical Staff Officers Courses. In affiliation with Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences (the Tanzanian National University), the college is in the process of becoming a Medical University, whereby the following degrees will be offered: Doctor of Medicine, Doctor of Dental Surgery, BSc Pharmacy, BSc Nursing. However, current challenges include critical staff shortages and minimal medical education resources including textbooks and peer-reviewed journals.

Opportunity: Program success for the Military College of Medical Sciences strengthens military medical capabilities in a strategically important East African Nation, in support of AFRICOM and broader DOD Global Health Engagement objectives. WRAIR research and PEPFAR programs require TPDF support for mission success. Bilateral relations between the Military College of Medical Sciences and Department of Defense has the potential to enhance training opportunities for students as well as create a framework for scholarly medical and research programs.
