Regular Meeting ----- July 25, 1991

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, D. L. Taylor at 7:00 A.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were John Groo and James Walker.

ATTENDANCE

Special Service District members present were Dan Holyoak, George White, and Bill McDougald.

Others present were Dale Pierson and Roberta Highland.

After calling for additions or corrections to the minutes of the meeting of July 11, 1991, and hearing none, the Chair declared the minutes approved as circulated to the Board.

MINUTES

D. L. asked if we should stop pumping the wells in the lower valley for the Moab Irrigation Co. Dale said he would like to build up storage in the reservoir. After a discussion, the Board agreed by consensus not to turn off the wells before Monday, July 29th, and continue to monitor the reservoir.

PUMPING TO THE M.I.C.

No bids were received for the office radio, so we will advertise another bid opening for the next meeting.

OFFICE RADIO

Dale reported that Bob Byrnes was back at work with his doctor's permission.

CREEK COMMISSIONER

Dan reported he will draw up an earnest money offer to Hecla Subdivision of \$2,000.00 for that lot prior to test pumping the Hecla Well.

HECLA WELL

Roberta reported she had contacted Mrs. Morrisey about the ad in the times for one share of Moab Irrigation Company. Mrs. Morrisey is planning on selling the share on August 1, 1991 to the highest offer. George moved to offer \$460. for the share. Shares were discussed, and George withdrew his motion. Bill moved to offer up to \$500.00 for the share. James Walker seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

ONE SHARE OF MOAB IRRIGATION STOCK

Charles Jeffs, General Manager of Rural Water Association of Utah presented a program on Wellhead protection and how the association could help rural areas in Utah. In Utah the program is called Drinking Water Source Protection Program since there are so many springs. Each well should be protected by 3 zones. Zone 1 = 100 ft. Zone 2 = 250 day Time Of Travel and Zone 3 = 15 year TOT. Jeffs stated he would help the District, and the first step is to form a community planning team. He suggested the team could include

the Manager, representatives from other government agencies such as the county, state and federal agencies, community leaders, etc. The 2nd step is to define the land area to be protected and the 3rd step is to identify and locate potential contaminants. High risk activities would include fertilizer and pesticide in our area. Managing the protection area could include zoning and management. Non regulatory mechanisms would include public education and technical assistance. One of the most important activity is to plan for the future. Jeffs stated he stands ready to assist the District in setting up this program. Bill McDougald stated he thought the District and City of Moab might have a joint community planning team. The first step in implementing this program, is to put together the team. Dan moved to form a Source Protection Management Team. Bill seconded. MOTION CARRIED. Bill suggested Dale be chairman of the committee. Those present agreed by consensus.


Dan moved the check list be approved. George seconded. MOTION CARRIED.


