[¬]oday's Gospel, a continuation of last week's Gospel, challenges us as followers of Jesus Christ to live out in our lives the Great Commandment of Love – to love all people, be they friend or foe, as God loves us. Though this ideal will no doubt be difficult to realize, nonetheless, it is one which we are called to attain. Jesus indicates specific ways to help us make this Commandment our rule of life: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." These example of love, as well as others put forth in the Gospel passage, are by no means easy to achieve. However, like the Apostles and the early Christians, we draw our strength from the selfless life of the Lord Jesus and its culmination in his death on the Cross. As disciples of Jesus, we must never turn away from

this ideal of selfless love; it is to become the measure of our lives. The Gospel ends, as it began last Sunday, pointing the way to true happiness – when we identify with God's generous ways and God's unconditional love, our joy will be great. The words which Jesus speaks at the end of today's Gospel confirm this: "A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back."


<u>February 27 - Memorial of Saint Gregory of Narek:</u> Gregor was born in a village on the shores of Lake Van between 945 and 950. When his parents died, Gregor and his older brother were raised by a scholarly uncle who had them educated at the Narek monastery where he was a monk. The monastery was a prominent center of learning located in what is now Turkey. Gregor too entered the monastery and was ordained in 977.</u> A professor of theology, Gregor wrote a mystical interpretation of the Song of Songs, and a long mystical poem called the Book of Prayer or the Book of Lamentations. He described his poem as "an encyclopedia of prayer for all nations." This classic of Armenian literature has been translated into 30 languages. The Russian text of the Book of Lamentations was set to music in 1985. Little else is known about Gregor, other than he died in the early 11th century and was buried within the walls of the Narek monastery where he had spent his life. In 2015 as the world observed the 100th anniversary of the Armenian genocide in the Ottoman Empire, Pope Francis concelebrated a Mass at the Vatican with Patriarch Nerses Bedros XIX Tarmouni and declared the monk, poet, and saint of the Armenian Apostolic Church, Gregory of Narek, a Doctor of the Church.
