

## Adult Speech and Language Therapy Service - Top Tips For Referring to Our Service

Referrals are accepted for adults 18 years + (we will see people over 16 years if not in statutory education) where consent has been given for the referral, and the referral criteria is met:

Referral Criteria	Referrals are NOT ACCEPTED WHEN:
<ul> <li>Eating, drinking and swallowing difficulties, with food / drink eg;</li> <li>Evidence of regular coughing, spluttering, gagging or choking during meals</li> <li>Recurrent chest infections / aspiration pneumonia (associated with difficulty with eating and drinking and aspiration is considered a possible cause</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Where the difficulties are purely with swallowing tablets *</li> <li>An individual is choosing softer food because of inadequate or missing dentition/personal preference</li> <li>An individual requires assistance with feeding (no evidence of swallowing difficulty) – if feeding equipment is required refer to Occupational Therapy via SPA</li> <li>Poor appetite / weight loss not related to a swallowing difficulty or advice regarding non-oral feeding (eg PEG) or supplements (refer to dietetics)*</li> </ul>
Voice difficulties (eg abnormal pitch, volume or quality for the speaker) NB	
an ENT examination is normally required prior to SLT referral	
<b>Respiratory Difficulties</b> – chronic cough, vocal cord dysfunction NB referrals	
only accepted following formal respiratory assessment and diagnosis	
Stammering/ stuttering— a difficulty speaking fluently	
Change in <b>speech clarity</b> (often as a result of a neurological change) e.g.	Speech clarity issues as a result of hearing impairment, or developmental speech
slurred speech	impairments (e.g. lisp)
Change in language functioning, which are impacting upon functioning in	Difficulties lie in acquiring English as an additional language, the individual does
everyday life, eg;	not have any difficulties in their first language.
Difficulties understanding spoken language	Developmental difficulties (e.g. autism*, language delay, dyslexia*)
Difficulties using words and sentences	
Normally as a result of neurological change (stroke, brain tumour)	
	Learning Disabilities – where this is the cause of the communication or swallowing difficulty.* We would work alongside the ALD team if the difficulty is on top of underlying learning disability (e.g. stroke)
	Mental Health Conditions – where the difficulty is as result of the mental health condition and outside of the expertise of the team for example; unstable mental health difficulties; psychosis; phobias, elective mutism
