

November 9th after the 11am mass.





All are invited to join Bishop Timothy Senior and catechists




The Word of God Alive:

Living our Faith: This week look around for ways to help those who are poor and let us also remember to thank God for all our blessings. Use your blessings to help others.




Thanksgiving Food Basket Collection


