Subject: 2018 IRS Updates – User fees for reinstatement application (IRS Form 1024

and 8718) have increased

The user fee has increased to \$600 for nonprofit organizations seeking reinstatement of their federal tax-exempt status under section 501(a), which includes recognition as a 501 (c)(19).

ALA chartered organizations submitting *IRS Form 1024 – Application for Recognition of Exemption Under Section 501 (a)* and *IRS Form 8718 – User Fee for Exempt Organization Determination Letter Request* must include the appropriate user fee and required information or the application may be returned to the organization.

EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS

Rev. Proc. 2018-5 Rev. Proc. 2018-5

This revenue procedure sets forth procedures for issuing determination letters on issues under the jurisdiction of the Director, Exempt Organizations (EO) Rulings and Agreements. Specifically, it explains the procedures for issuing determination letters on exempt status (in response to applications for recognition of exemption from Federal income tax under § 501 or § 521 other than those subject to Rev. Proc. 2018–4, this Bulletin (relating to pension, profit-sharing, stock bonus, annuity, and employee stock ownership plans)), private foundation status, and other determinations related to exempt organizations. These procedures also apply to revocation or modification of determination letters. This revenue procedure also provides guidance on the exhaustion of administrative remedies for purposes of declaratory judgment under § 7428. Finally, this revenue procedure provides guidance on applicable user fees for requesting determination letters.

The new Residential Mental Health Rehabilitation facility is now open. This added 25 new beds to house Veterans in various treatment programs with on-site housing on the hospital campus. The staff requesting donations has put forward that donations in kind, rather than monetary donations, would best fill this need. Units 102, 131, 132, 109 and District 2 have responded to this need and we ordered 250 backpacks and water bottles in July, we ordered athletic equipment, adult coloring books, crayons, colored pencils and yoga mats during December with the final delivery on January 2nd, 2018. The Building 95 donation was made possible largely by a very generous donation from Unit 102.

Employee Appreciation Luncheon was held on March 7th, 2018. There were many volunteers and generous donations of salads and desserts. Thank you to all Department officers and the National President for volunteering to assist with this event. A total of 632 staff were served between 11AM and 1PM.

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman James Katzenberger, the opening ceremony was conducted and guests were introduced.

Palmer Miller and Kim Rodrigues reported on "The Mission of HOHP/Honoring, Hiring and Helping our Heroes of Pinal County, the Creation of Eagle One (mobile Veteran outreach), and Pinal County Veterans Center". Pinal County is stepping up to provide services for needy veterans in Pinal County. They were able to acquire a mobile for \$1.00. The unit travels throughout Pinal County servicing our veterans. Michael Herbert, Administrative Officer, Volunteer Services, PVAHCS/Phoenix Veterans Affairs Health Care System. They are looking for more volunteers. There will be an event on April 17th at 10:00 a.m. at American Legion Post 1. They have quarterly meetings. For more information contact Michael.herbert2@va.gov. We need to give vets a hand up not a hand out.

Barbara Hatch and Michelle DiMuro from Veterans Heritage Program gave an update on the Veterans Heritage Program. They also invited everyone to attend the next book signing on April 8th in Scottsdale. The Program was started in 2004, in 2009 it became a 501(c)3. Currently they have 29 chapters and their goal is to grow into all 50 states. So far 1820 veteran's stories have been told and preserved with the library of Congress. This program is the largest contributor to our veteran's heritage at the Library of Congress.

Carol Culbertson took the roll, and a quorum was established. A motion was made to accept the minutes, second and approved.

Treasure Jim Denzien gave the treasurer's report. Currently there is \$55,535.21 in all the accounts combined.

Luis Cardenas-Camacho from Congressman Gallego's Office gave a short report.

Judith Hatch gave a report on the upcoming Memorial Day program being held on Monday, May 28, 2018 at the National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona. She encouraged those wishing to display their wreath's at the ceremony to confirm with Sue Wudy.

Dr. Maureen McCarthy, Chief of Staff, Phoenix VA Medical Facilities reported on some issues being addressed at the VA Medical Facility. Dr. McCarthy reported that next week they will be celebrating one year of stable leadership at the Phoenix VA Facilities. There have been a number of site visits from

various inspection teams, insuring the health, welfare and safety of the facility. These visits only identified a few minor issues which have been corrected. She further advised the membership that the Phoenix VA is the largest user of the "Choice" program. May 16th they will be launching a smoke free campus campaign. There will be two locations for the smokers to go. One for employees and one for veterans and visitors. They are looking at having this totally in effect by the beginning of July. The VA will be conducting an extensive lung cancer screening program along with a smoking cessation program. "No Shows" continue to be a problem. About 6,000 vets a month fail to show for their appointments. Everyone is encouraged to make sure that they show up for appointments or be sure to cancel so other veterans can be put in your place. The VA is upgrading their electrical system. This will result in some scheduled power outages until the upgrade is completed. They try to do these upgrades during down times for the clinics. May 21 & 22 there will be an emergency medical exercise in Phoenix, which will include the VA Medical Facility.

Terry Araman gave an update on the Legislative issues dealing with veterans and their programs.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

It was announced that all the funds needed to refurbish the WWI Memorial have been received. The repairs should be started soon.

May 5 and June 2 meetings of the UAV will be held in the basement of the VA Medical Facility ACC.
